Hendrix, Janie. **Jimi Hendrix: An Illustrated Experience.** (New York: Atria Books, 2007) NW 787.8716 HENDRIX 2007; R 787.8716 HENDRIX 2007 (Historic Reference) Tracing Hendrix's life and career, this tribute includes reproductions of handwritten lyrics, photos, and a CD of previously unreleased recordings.

Jaunal, Jack W. **Fort Lawton.** (Charleston, South Carolina: Arcadia Publishing, 2008) NW 979.7772 JAUNAL 2008 Chiefly black and white photographs with brief captions; this is a pictorial history of Fort Lawton, site of the events in *On American Soil* (see Hamann above).

Johnson, Charles Richard. **Passing the Three Gates: Interviews with Charles Johnson.** (Seattle: University of Washington Press, 2004)

NW 813.54 JOHNSON 2004; R 813.54 JOHNSON 2004 (Historic Reference) Charles R. Johnson is a National Book Award-winning author who has been a professor at the University of Washington since 1976.

NW 364.134 PFEIFER 2004 This study includes charts comparing lynching statistics in several states, including Washington.

Trimble, Jaymi. **Roslyn.** (Charleston, South Carolina: Arcadia Publishing, 2008) NW 979.757 TRIMBLE 2008 This history of a Washington coal mining town consists chiefly of black and white photographs with brief captions. Roslyn was settled by several different ethnic groups including African Americans.
