"So what have you done for me lately?" I like to think of this as a consultant's phrase but perhaps it is not. It expresses that the value of the services that we deliver is definitely finite. People quickly forget about what great things we did one or two years ago. It also recognizes the turnover that occurs over time not only in staffing but also among elected positions and other stakeholders.

So why do I start this staff report with this phrase. WLA's and WLMA's day for members to visit with their legislators in Olympia occurred on Friday, February 15, 2013. The Washington State Library again hosted a reception in the conference room of the Secretary of State. WLA and WLMA members could stop between visits, have coffee, water, and a cookie, and sit for a few minutes. Some members did stop in and talk about their visits with the elected house or senate official or a member of their legislative staff. What struck me is the overall lack of knowledge exhibited by legislators about what the State Library does and how it benefits libraries and their constituents locally. One Senator asked the member for just one example of how the State Library is of value to libraries and local communities because he cannot recall that the State Library is anything more than a building.

It reminds me that we can never rest on our laurels. We must continue to do good work otherwise we become less (or not) relevant. In addition we must always work to create awareness and educate people about the services we provide. These are ongoing tasks not reserved for one part of the year or when it is convenient. I'm sure that is similar in your own situation at your library. Only the stakeholders change somewhat. Please feel free to tell our story and yours whenever the situation presents itself.

 - Hosted an online meeting of the project's advisory committee which selected a proposal and vendor/contractor for the project

Digital Literacy—Jennifer Fenton

• The Digital Literacy Advisory team and internal WSL team met online on 1/7. Eighteen participants contributed to the discussion of a Digital Literacy project for WSL. The team worked on refining resources for the webpage.

E-Rate—Gary Bortel

- The Form 471 filing window for E-rate Funding Year 2013 opened on 12/12/12 and will close 3/14/13.
- Thirty-three libraries in Washington State filed new Form 470s in time to take advantage of the upcoming funding year.

Grants Management—Anne Yarbrough

- The LSTA Annual Report, also known as the State Programs Report, for the use of 2011 LSTA funding was submitted to IMLS on December 28. This 158 page report is inclusive of all LSTA supported programs and projects supported by 2011 LSTA funds. We are currently waiting for the letter notifying us that the report has been officially accepted.
- Work continues to process claims, read reports, and monitor subgrant activity associated with 2012 subgrants for Transforming Life after 50, Connecting Libraries through Resource Sharing, and Washington Rural Heritage.
- Grant cycles have been developed for the use of 2013 LSTA funding. Washington Rural
 Heritage and Broadband Grant cycles opened 3/1 and Connecting Libraries through
 Resource Sharing will open 4/1. In addition to the LSTA grants, a mini-grant cycle
 funded by the Department of Early Learning (DEL) will open early March to help libraries
 support DEL's Race to the Top Early Learning Challenge (RTT-ELC) goals.

Koha ILS Proof of Concept Project—Gary Bortel

- WSL has begun working with the Cathlamet Public Library to convert existing MARC records for use with the shared KOHA ILS.
- Davenport Public Library has expressed interest in participation in this project.

Library as Instructional Leader — Diane Hutchins with Lynn Kanne

- LSTA Institutional Repository (IR) Team was formed to:
 - Institute a repository to include content currently under development as well as information literacy (IL) content that is part of the Open Course Library (Goal 1 of the grant);
 - Curate IL content, including shareable content currently under development as well as IL content that is part of the Open Course Library (Goal 2 of the grant).
- During the report period, this team:
 - Held a virtual meeting to kick-off the design work for the project;
 - Started to compile information about platforms and metadata specifications for the platform and are currently evaluating them against a rubric of design specifications and product features;
 - o Discussed research and information gathered at ALA Midwinter; and
 - Began to draft user-generated metadata standards for the COIL (see below) project submissions that will go into the IL repository.

- LSTA COIL (Collaborative Open Information Literacy) Teams were formed to:
 - Develop shareable information literacy content, emphasizing locally relevant resources that could be easily customized for use across the CTC system, with a particular focus on the growing use of e-Learning at the CTCs (Goal 3 of the grant).
- During the report period, these teams:
 - Submitted 4 proposals (all accepted) for collaborative, inter-college teams of librarians to create tutorials on the following specific IL concepts and skills:
 - Information Cycle
 - Generating Keywords/Search Terms
 - Source Evaluation
 - Recognizing Bias in Information Sources

Note: Each tutorial will include student learning outcomes and an assessment tool to measure student learning.

Online Trustee Wiki—Diane Hutchins

- Continued work on WSL Library Trustee Manual Revision and Conversion Project including:
 - Conducting research to locate online sources to include in wiki, including AG
 Opinions and Articles of the Washington State Constitution that are relevant to topics under discussion;
 - Working with WSL staff to locate print copy of a key early AG Opinion and convert it into digital format to make it accessible from the wiki;
 - Completing draft of Library Establishment section of wiki;
 - o Beginning work on draft of Budgeting section of wiki;
 - Revising and adding new resources to the following sections:
 - Board Meetings;
 - Library Trustees;
 - Laws Affecting Libraries;
 - Public Records
 - Working with Jeremy Stroud to convert Word document drafts to HTML for wiki environment, enabling initial group of reviewers to access wiki and provide feedback on work to date.

Off the Page: Downloadable Audio Books—Will Stuivenga

- Compiled and distributed Washington Digital Library Consortium (WDLC) annual report.
- Working with WDLC Executive Advisory Committee, developed 2013 WDLC budget scenarios, conducted formal WDLC membership budget and related issues balloting, finalized budget, submitted invoicing data to Fiscal.
- In an experimental project to explore patron-driven eBook acquisition, using LSTA funds from the eBook Reader Pilot Project through September 2013, implemented the Recommend to Library (RTL) feature for the WDLC Washington Anytime Library (OverDrive) platform; a report on this experiment will be written once the LSTA funding is completed. The current implementation allows patron recommendations (1 per week per patron) to be automatically purchased without staff intervention. Am closely monitoring expenditures and making any adjustments as needed (Example: initial setting for 5 recommendations per week was quickly dropped to 1).
- Coordinated an ALA Midwinter meeting between myself, OverDrive CEO, Steve Potash,
 Ann Roseberry, Richland Public Library director, Amanda Six, Libraries of Stevens County

director, and Jennifer Dixey, Whatcom County Library System, representing the WDLC Executive Advisory Committee, regarding the possibility of Richland and Stevens County libraries joining the WDLC, despite being "pre-existing" OverDrive customers prior to the expansion of the WDLC throughout the state, and thus currently contractually barred from participation. Expecting imminent official response from OverDrive.

Worked with the Agency's contracts officer, Bill Fieber, to iron out contractual issues
revolving around the Recorded Books terms of use, which have been casually
substituted for those originally negotiated with OCLC NetLibrary, without going through
an approval process.

Race to the Top-Early Learning Challenge (RTT-ELC): Martha Shinners and Diane Hutchins

- Background: Dr. Bette Hyde, Director of the Department of Early Learning (DEL), invited WSL to submit a proposal that would help libraries to support DEL's Race to the Top – Early Learning Challenge (RTT-ELC) goals. During this report period, activities related to the proposal include:
 - Meeting to discuss proposed contract concerns and draft responses to DEL staff;
 - Participating in conference calls with DEL staff and staff from ELPLP member libraries to discuss proposal concerns;
 - Working with staff from DEL, members of the early learning community, and
 OSOS contracts staff to resolve contracting concerns;
 - o Drafting position description for .5 FTE for project; and
 - Drafting grant application guidelines.
- An early learning proposal, Local Libraries and Early Literacy Systems Change, in partnership with the Oregon State Library, was accepted for the April OLA/WLA conference.
- Follow up was done in response to requests from Elaine Meyers, who is working with New Yotk State to plan an early literacy project, and included additional information, resources, planning material and samples from WTBL and ECCR initiatives, and additional background information on Project Views.

Summer Reading—Martha Shinners

- Updates to the Summer Reading website are being done as additional materials and information on the 2013 program become available from the Collaborative.
- Ideas for slogans for the 2015 theme of *Heroes* and suggestions for the 2016 program
 theme were collected from WA libraries and sent to CSLP for use at the annual meeting
 in April.
- Working with Josephine Camarillo from Ellensburg (WSL rep) and Meredith Hale from Pierce County Library (CAYAS rep) on their attendance at the April annual CSLP meeting in Atlanta.
- Sixteen rural libraries responded to a survey to solicit feedback on possible in-person training this spring. Based on response, working with Carolyn to design training that can be done online or incorporated to Carolyn's small library site visits.

Teacher Library Common Core Cadres (TLC3)—Martha Shinners

 The new initiative project was officially named Teacher Library Common Core Cadre (TLC3) at the December 6th meeting. The name reflects the goal to provide resources and professional development for teacher-librarians to serve as building and district leaders for the successful implementation of Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in English Language Arts (ELA).

- After a discussion at the February 1 meeting, the decision was made that committee members would attend the National Council on Computer Education (NCCE) full day *Teacher Librarian Summit* in Portland February 27th to gather resources and to use small group planning time to develop an outline for the TLC3 summer training, a full day of training at 6 Education Service Districts (ESD) in August 2013 with the goal of:
 - Providing resources and professional development for teacher-librarians to serve as building and district leaders for the successful implementation of Common Core State Standards in English Language Arts (ELA).
 - Supporting reading for information, understanding text complexity, and developing research skills to strengthen student success through school library information and technology programs.
 - Empowering teacher librarians to be key allies in CCSS implementation by providing resources and training opportunities to develop and strengthen school library resources and techniques for supporting teachers and students.
 - Sharing messaging and professional development tools that will be available to all educators and school administrators, public librarians, and communities engaged with Common Core implementation.
- Dennis Small at Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) contacted the 6 identified ESDs to facilitate WSL securing summer training sites. TLC3 flyers were developed and distributed at the Washington Library Media Association booth at the NCCE conference; WLMA is a partner in the TLC3 initiative.
