"Our Northern Rivals."

Under the above caption the San Francisco Chronicle discourses as follows as to the bright future of Phoget Sound and its railroad and ship connections:

"The completion of the Northern Pacific Railway from Lake Superior to some point on Puget Sound within, at farthest, a year and a half from this date, is an assured fact, With that part of the road which lies east of the Rocky Mountains we are not concerned. Whatever resouces of the country may be developed by the road they will all naturally drift eastward. But the trade of Idaho, Orgon and Washington Territory will all come west, and there will be enough of it to create a great commercial city at the ternious of the road on Puget Sound. Already, in anticipation of the event, Seattle, New Tacoma and all the possible towns along the Sound up to Olympia are feeling the effects of that inspiration which springs from high holes of the future. No doubt most of them will find the reality far below expectation, but at least one city must and will spring up, from the feeding of this road, into a position of rivalry with San Francisco for a large amount of trade that we have hitherto almost exclusively enjoyed. The Northern Pacific is a very powerful corporation. Assuming, as we probably may, that Congress will not disturb its lapsed land grant, it will have a surplus of more than \$20,000,000 after completing and equipping its road and constructing several necessary branches as feeders. It can easily borrow \$25,000,000 on the unmortraged part of its grant. It is ambitious.
