Tax trade dollar is soon to pass out of existence, the national House of Representatives having passed a bill authorizing its retirement from circulation. The bill provides that until the first of July, 1884, any person may deposit at any mint in the Union trade dollars and receive in exchange at full weight, dollar for dollar, standard silver dollars.
