

# PUGET SOUND WEEKLY ARGUS SUPPLEMENT.

PORT TOWNSEND, WASHINGTON TERRITORY, JULY 6, 1877.

**ACCOMMODATION.**—The steamer Phantom is to be placed on the route between this port and Seattle. She will leave here on Monday and Saturday mornings at eight, and return, leaving Seattle on Tuesday and Sunday mornings at the above named hour. Ports Gamble and Ludlow are to be included in the stopping places. There seems to have been some difficulty within the last few months, to get a vessel for this route, that could not be bought off. As the Phantom has been started to accommodate the traveling public, obviating the necessity of frequently waiting either at Seattle or this port two or three days for the North Pacific, it is hoped she may succeed, and public convenience be suited.

## Telegraphic Summary.

**THE INDIAN WAR.**  
Under date of June 30th, General Howard writes from Salmon river: "Our command is crossing Salmon river, which is swift, deep and difficult. The Indians are gone from our front, and are apparently encamped in or near the junction of the Snake river and Little Salmon trails. Have sent cavalry out to pick up about 20 renegades near the forks of the Clear Water."

Gov. Potts, of Montana, telegraphs to the headquarters of the division of the Pacific, to the effect that about 200 Flathead Indians have recently disappeared from the Bitter Root valley, and it is thought they have joined Chief Joseph's band.

**THE WAR IN THE EAST.**  
LONDON, July 2.—A Berlin special asserts that a general understanding with regard to certain eventualities has been lately arrived at between the Austrian and English governments.

The Turks made a desperate sortie from Kars last Monday forenoon, attempting to surprise the Russians and storm the hill on which are several guns used in the bombardment of Kars. The Turks were compelled to withdraw after several hours fighting. Losses heavy on both sides.

It is estimated that 30,000 Russians crossed the Danube at Sistova. They are advancing on Biela, and a fresh battle is expected.

It is understood that the wise counsels of Marquis of Salisbury, Earl Carnarvon, Mr. Cross and others have at last triumphed over the opposite party. The Sultan has now little chance of material aid from England.

Last Saturday's "Review" sums up the political situation, so far as concerns European Turkey, thus: At the end of a costly campaign, though it may perhaps have been victorious, Russians will depend on the permission of Austria to effect a permanent conquest in Turkey.
