IMPORTANT ACQUISITIONS.—The New York Sun is authority for the statement that Charles Francis Adams has announced himself for Tilden. On the other hand Carl Schurz has declared himself in favor of Hayes and Wheeler.

THE SIOUX WAR.—Gen. Terry's official report of the recent massacre by the Indians of General Custer and the five companies under his immediate command came to hand last Monday. From this it appears that Custer, although possibly acting in violation of orders, did what any other officer, perhaps, with the latitude and freedom of judgment usually conceded to an officer operating with an independent command might have done.

OPENING UP THE COUNTRY.—As one of the results of the present war with the Indians is likely to be the confinement to narrow reservations of their remnant, it will be of great advantage to Montana and the Big Horn country to the south of it, in causing their settlement and development when freed from Indian depredations.

THE WAR BETWEEN TURKEY AND HER DEPENDENCIES still continues, and thus far Servia appears to have gained some advantages, if the reports are entitled to credit. Turkey has an army, on paper, of 450,000 men, while Servia has less than one-fourth as many, with superior officers, mostly Russian veterans.

Before the House naval committee on the 13th, Secretary Robeson showed that prior to his becoming Secretary of the Navy, he owned real estate in New Jersey valued at \$25,000, and had an annual income of \$7,500.

LATEST NEWS.

By Telegraph. Gold in New York, 1114. Legal tenders in Portland—buying \$91, selling 901. There is a strong probability that Robeson will be impeached. Congress will probably adjourn next week.

All the Indians who wish to join Crook are allowed to leave their reservations for that purpose by order of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Gov. Bennett declines the office of Governor of Idaho.

The appropriation bills are still in an unsettled condition. A severe shock of earthquake visited Vienna on the 17th. Damage not reported.

The House has appropriated \$100,000 for the continuance of work on the Washington Monument. Terribly hot weather still raging in the East. No appearance of rain.

The President was much prostrated by the heat on the 14th. He has been ordered to take a recess. A special from Fort Lincoln says that Sitting Bull was killed, also a white man named Milburn, Sitting Bull's chief advisor. The wounded soldiers are recovering and there will be no more deaths. It is thought that Sitting Bull's band obtained some \$20,000, the soldiers having just been paid off.

Tilden and Hendricks are at Saratoga.

As Cameron held the chairmanship of the National Republican Committee while a member of Grant's cabinet, strong appeals are made to him to resign.

The House has granted a pension of \$50 a month to the widow of Gen. Custer; his life was insured for \$5,000.

The crop prospects of Iowa were never more promising.

Gen. Terry's dispatch to Crook confirms Custer's fate, and implies very plainly that had Custer waited one day longer Gibbon would have joined him. Terry is anxious for Crook to join forces, make plans and execute them regardless of rank.

The Indians are still hovering about the Little Big Horn, and are trying to burn out the soldiers by setting the grass on fire all around.

It is rumored that the Prince Imperial will visit Philadelphia in September.

Col. Russell, the owner of the stallion Smuggler, which trotted the fastest time on record at Philadelphia on the 10th inst., was offered \$100,000 for the animal; he refused to sell.

John Moore was sun-struck in New York a week ago; for six days he neither spoke, opened his eyes, ate or drank anything. He died on the 6th day. Doctors are baffled.

James Gordon Bennett has given \$10,000, Clara Louise Kellogg \$1,000 and Lawrence Barrett \$2,000 to the Custer Monument fund.

The fast mail trains were discontinued last Saturday.

Large reinforcements of infantry and cavalry are daily being sent to the relief of Crook and Terry.

The week's developments confirm the belief that the European powers will remain neutral in the Turkish-Servian war. This policy is entirely satisfactory to Russia, for when Turkey dies of suicide or other cause, is her opportunity for conquest of the territory.

Turkey throws the responsibility of its present struggle upon Servia, but thinks the Porte will attempt to bring it to a prompt close in order to carry out the projected reforms and improvements.

The steamer Erin, which sails from London on August 12th, for New York, will bring numerous specimens of live stock for the International cattle show at Philadelphia.

The paying admissions to the Centennial on the 15th inst amounted to \$19,000.

President Grant criticizes Hayes' letter of acceptance very severely. Thinks it reflects on the Administration; and said he hoped the time would come when the American people will be permitted to elect their President for as long a time as they choose. His entire manner indicated dissatisfaction with the political situation. The feeling is growing that the President has cut loose from his party affiliations.

The President has ordered Morrill to make Dr. Broadhead first auditor and Butterfield fifth auditor in the Treasury. These two men were formally dismissed by Bristow for good causes.

LOCAL NEWS.
