SPOKANE. "A Land Flowing with Milk and Honey"

[From the Northern Pacific Railway Journal.] The days of "boom" have departed, whether to be deplored or otherwise must be as the reader may best decide.

WASHINGTON TERRITORY. Assuming that the reader is already familiar with its geographical position, it behooves me but to make passing allusion to it in general, and confine myself to that portion of its grand subdivision known as the GREAT SPOKANE COUNTRY.

SPOKANE COUNTY IS the most easterly of the Territory. To the north it is Stevens, lying between it and the British possessions. Its area is 10,000 square miles.

The hotel accommodations are entirely inadequate to the rapidly increasing development of the town and to receive the many who are daily finding their way from the east in search of homes in Eastern Washington.

SPOKANE FALLS. "Down whose current clear and strong flows, confined in mutual disapproval, Lo, and Christian roll along."

The Cannon Mills, fitted with the latest labor-saving machinery, has a capacity of turning out daily 15,000 feet of lumber, and also does the same amount. In addition to this, the output is 15,000 shingles, 15,000 boards, and 10,000 pickets.

THE METHODIST CHURCH, the immediate construction of which is looked for, will be an imposing structure situated on the north bank of the river, commanding a charming view of the falls, with its high towers, will be provided with spacious basement and clerical grounds, gymnasium, etc., having a tract of 40 or 50 acres.

THE POST FLOURING MILL, which has hitherto afforded the chief market for grain and supply the local demand for flour, is soon to be enlarged and take place with others now building around it, in the manufacture of flour for foreign shipment.

BRICK YARDS. I am told that there are now five yards in successful operation, and yet much building must be delayed for another season on account of their inability to supply the great demand. (Veneering with brick is not done here, excepting in the case of cheap residences, all business buildings constructed of that material are of solid brick walls, iron-fronts, French plate windows.)

COUNTY ASSESSMENT. Spokane county property was assessed as below during the years named: 1881, \$21,820; 1882, \$144,024; 1883, \$1,630,512.

PRINCIPAL TOWNS. Surrounding the commercial metropolis - Spokane Falls - and contribute so much to its rapid growth, prosperity and permanent stability, are Cheney, Sprague, Davenport, Deep Creek Falls, Redford, Rathdrum, Farmington, Medical Lake, Colville and some of minor importance.
