Meantime the rabble went to Prichard's cabin, where he had his summer's provisions laid in, and not

mer's provisions laid in, and not nly carried away whatever they vanted, but also set to work and desonly carried away whatever they wanted, but also set to work and destroyed the remainder of the provisions and all the tools. The majority of the party from California joined the Montana crowd and denounced Prichard as "a liar, a bilk and a lunatic." "Hang him it hang him?" was the cry they finally raised, but as there was no concentrated effort or unanimity of opinion, he has gone unhung up to the present day.

I am the only one now remaining of the party from California; the last of the others took their departure in the latter part of July. I have been prospecting most of the time since came into these mountains and now can state for a certainty that there is gold in paying quantities throughout a vast extent of country.

Prichard creek is about fifteen miles in length and will average forty rods wide in the lottom or valley for at least ten miles. There is

ley for at least ten miles. There is gold, quite coarse and in paying quantities, this whole distance. As yet there are but four claims opened on the creek. I am now working about five and a half miles from the mouth, and we have been averaging about one ounce per day to the man, nearly all coarse gold. The largest nugget we have yet found weighs two ounces, three pennyweights and three grains. The gold sells for \$18 per ounce. There is a little quartz in the weight.

creek is also rich in gold. Eagle creek is also rich in gold. It is fitteen or twenty miles in length and has been prospected for ten or twelve miles. Prichard creek empties into Eagle creek about four miles from its, mouth and Eagle creek empties into the north fork of the Cœur d'Alene river. Now, since word has got out that there are really good diggings here, the rabble and rough-seruff of Montana, Idaho, Washington Territory and Oregon are coming in great mobs and Jumpfing elatins right and left. Several miners came in from Montana carly in the season and have assisted in season and have assisted in eveloping the mines. I have found Mr. Prichard truth-

ful in every particular as regards placer mines and quartz ledges.
