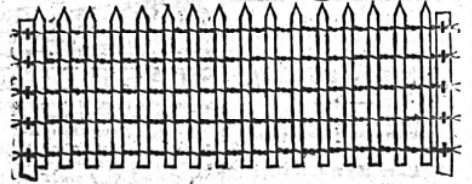

## BULLY BOYS!

The City Fire-Department Proves the Metal it is Made of.

A Tremendous Conflagration Averted.

Spokane Falls Singed Again, but Still a Smiling.

Saturday morning a little after four o'clock, officer Hubbard, who was on the corner of Howard street and Riverside avenue, had his attention attracted by an ominous light in the vicinity of Wolverson's brick, at the corner of Mill street and Riverside avenue, and he at once gave the alarm of fire. In the absence of a bell, the population depended upon lungs and pistols to spread the news of the existence of a fire, and the rapid cracking of guns soon drew a large share of the community to the front. The firemen had both carts at the scene in a few minutes, but the fire had gained considerable headway and it looked as though a big piece of our city was doomed to destruction. The construction, situation and character of the buildings were such as to make the work of the firemen very laborious and compelled them to fight against great disadvantages. It was a severe test and there is no place in the city where the drawbacks to successful work could be more numerous. The flames had completely away in the rear of the one-story frame building occupied by T. J. Brunk as a quartermaster and glassware establishment and McMoran's drug store. To the west, connected by a frame passage way, is Wolverson's brick, and in the rear, fronting on Mill street, is a row of frame buildings clear to the alley. To the east was Rudolph's two-story frame building, and attached thereto is a continuous row of frames extending clear around to and up Howard street to Main, with only French's brick to break the progress of a fire, should it get a fair start. Rescues No. 1 took water at the corner of Howard and Mill streets and Riverside avenue, and Spokane No. 2 at the corner of Mill and Riverside avenue and Main and Mill streets. Within ten minutes after the alarm four terrific streams were playing on the fire. Without a recognized head there was slight confusion at first, but that was soon remedied and for two hours the boys did noble service, and the water works earned all the encomiums that have been said of them. It only required a very few minutes to extinguish the body of the blaze, but the insidious flames ate their way under the roofs of Rudolph's bakery and Wolverson's brick, and it required hard work to get at it. The upper story of Rudolph's building was gutted before the fire at that point was extinguished, but the flames to the east were not even scorched. It was a long struggle at the brick before the fire succumbed and a perfect deluge of water was thrown into the building. The upper story is cut into small rooms, and so constructed as to prevent firemen from reaching the flames. The fire was confined to the brick so that it did not burst out of the roof, but the rooms were badly damaged. The stores occupied by Brunk and Moran were completely wrecked, but the fronts still stand, charred and blackened. Considering the locality of the fire it is not saying too much to state that no fire department could have done better work, and the experience has taught the public that our water works surpass any other system in existence for protection against fire. Before alarm was given the watchman at Echo mill noticed the fire and awakened Mr. Jones, who has temporary charge and that gentleman immediately applied the necessary pressure. Not for a moment did the works fall, and sufficient water was thrown on the buildings to put out a fire ten times as large if the firemen had a fair show. This is the first time the works and department have been tested in the hour of danger, and judging from the praise we hear on every hand everybody feels satisfied with both. Had the city been without works almost the entire business center would have been destroyed, entailing a loss of hundreds of thousands of dollars.

THE LOSS.  
W.M. Wolverson's damage to stock by breakage and water, will probably reach \$10,000; insured in the following companies, represented by B. H. Bennett: Boatman's, of Pittsburg, \$1250; Girard, of Philadelphia, \$1250; Irving, of New York, \$3000; London and Northwestern, of London, \$2500. The building was insured for \$2500 in the Liverpool and London and Globe, represented by Boyer & Peel, and the damage by fire and water will probably exceed that amount.

Mr. Wolverson owned the frame building occupied by T. J. Brunk and McMoran & Bevin's, which was a total loss, as only the charred shell remains standing. He carried no insurance in this building; loss, about \$1500.  
McMoran & Bevin's stock of drugs was valued at \$7000, and the loss is estimated at \$6000; no insurance.  
T. J. Brunk's loss will probably exceed \$3000, upon which he carried \$2164 insurance in the Fireman's Fund and German American.  
A. Rudolph's loss on building is about \$3200, and about \$1200 on his stock in the Pennsylvania, of Philadelphia. He carried no insurance whatever on his building.  
T. C. Griffiths, attorney as law, occupied rooms in the Wolverson building. His fine law library, and office furniture and fixtures valued at \$2000, were a total loss. He carried no insurance. Within the past few days he had put in a full set of California reports, at a cost of \$250.  
Sergeant Moore's signal service office was damaged to the extent of \$100.  
J. Kennedy Stout, damage to law library and office furniture, about \$300.  
J. D. Sherwood, occupied a room in the Wolverson building, and his loss in furniture, clothing, etc., will reach \$1000; no insurance.  
A. P. Wolverson, who owns the frame building on Mill street adjoining the brick, loses \$150 by damage by fire and water; no insurance.  
NOTES AND INCIDENTS.  
Mr. Brunk gives us the following particulars regarding the origin of the fire: For some time an unknown man has been in the habit of sleeping in the rear of Brunk's building, and getting tired of the intruder, Mr. Brunk concluded to rid himself of the individual. Last night about one o'clock he heard some one nosing around in the rear and at once started back to give him a warm reception. The fellow heard Brunk coming and fled, but Brunk took a flying shot at him for luck. About an hour and a half afterwards he was awakened by the glass in the back windows cracking and discovered the entire rear in flames. He turned and fled, and he ran off to the firemen and returned the building out of revenge.  
The firemen return thanks to Mrs. M. Thompson and C. F. Clough, both of whom treated the boys to hot coffee, and there was never a crowd that needed such refreshments more.  
It is calculated that the water works saved property enough to pay for itself twice over.  
It would be invidious to speak of any one person in particular as working at the fire when all did so well. The people are to be congratulated upon having so efficient a fire department.  
A canary bird hanging in a cage in McMoran's drug store passed through a baptism by fire and water, and came out as lively as though nothing had occurred.  
We commend the pluck of A. Rudolph, the unfortunate baker. He only purchased the premises he occupied two weeks ago, and having no insurance met with a total loss. Before the fire was extinguished while the bake room contained a foot of water he started in baking bread for the day. No common misfortune can keep such a man down for any length of time.
