the earth either in California or Australia have been found in these digings. I rom present appearances it would appear that the mines are almost inexhaustible, and so far there is no reason to doubt that the ledges will continue to hold out. The placers, as far as worked, have paid wonderfully, and as this process of mining is yet to be developed it may yet exceed the expectations of the most sunguine.

The Court d'Alene mines are situated in the fastnesses of the range of mountains of the same name situated about 30 miles east, or a little north of east, from Spokane Falls. There are several routes into the mines, but very probable next spring the best and easiest of travel will be from this city. The route from here off the now projected road is by fire way this city. The route from here on will be practicable to wagon travel all the year round. There are sev-eral stations on the trill, the chief ones being Post Cœur d'Alene'; the Mission and Evolution, the lat-tre being a feeding station. Besides the overland travel there will be conveyances by water from the Post-fow within a short distance of the junction of Prichard and Eagle creeks. 
