County Commissioner's Proceedings.

Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Spokan County W. T., at a special term held Feb. 18, 1880.

Board met at 1 o'clock P. M. Present, Chairman Roberts, Commissioners Van Wie and Jennings, Sheriff, Tappen and Nosler, Clerk. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

In the matter of laying out county roads; petitions for the viewing and laying out of the following roads were presented and read, to-wit: A road leading from Spokan Falls to the Idaho line on the north side of the river.

Road leading from Spokan Falls to intersect the Colville road near Beaver creek.

Road leading from the Spokan river to the bridge on the little Spokan.

Road leading from Deep Creek falls to sw corner of section 29 tp 25 range 40.

Road leading from Spokan Falls to the Idaho line on the south side of the river.

Road leading from the Territorial road 1/2 of a mile north of Spangle to intersect the road leading from Rattler's run to the town of Spangle.

Ordered that said roads be viewed and laid out. Viewers for the same were appointed.

In the matter of the report of G. W. Spangle and Wm. Sanders, road viewers; ordered that the report be accepted and the road ordered opened, said road runs as follows: Beginning at a point on the county road running from Hoxe's ranch via Paterson's ranch directly west of half mile stake on the west line of section 32, T. 23, Range 43; thence east to half mile stake on east side of section 32, thence east 1/2 mile to territorial road at sw corner of G. W. Spangle's ranch.

Board adjourned until 9 A. M. tomorrow, Feb. 17, 1880.

Board met at 9 A. M. Pursuant to adjournment. In the matter of Road Petitions; petitions having been presented and read, praying for the viewing and laying out of the following roads, to-wit: Road from Morris ranch to south and Marshall's saw mill on Lake creek.

Road running from the SE corner of section 2 in tp 25 range 29, to a point where Spring creek crosses the north line of township 26 range 33.

Said petitions were granted and viewers appointed for the same; or dered that the viewers view said roads on the 15th day of March 1880 or within five days thereafter.

In the matter of road petitions to view a county road beginning at the SE corner of section 2 township 25 range 39, thence south 2 miles, thence east one mile, thence south one mile, thence east two miles; there being a remonstrance against said petition, no action in the matter was taken by the Board.

In the matter of organizing road districts; ordered that the county be divided into road districts numbered and defined as follows, to-wit: No. 149; township 25, range 43, and two tiers of sections lying on the east side town 25 range 43.

No. 141; all of range 42 in Spokan county, lying north of the Spokan river.

No. 143; all of range 43 lying north of the Spokan river in Spokan county, except that part of said range lying in town 25.

No. 148; all of range 44 in said county lying north of the Spokan river.

No. 144; all of range 45 and 46 north of Spokan river in said county. No. 145; township 24 N, range 44, 45 and 46 and the four tiers of sections on the north side of township 23, range 44, 45 and 46.

No. 148; township 25 range 41 and four tiers of sections on the west side of township 25, range 42, running north of Spokan river.

No. 147; township 26 and 27 range 40 and 41.

Board adjourned until 9 A. M. tomorrow, Feb. 18, 1880.
