Western Farming.

Though the farmers in our western prairie States have the most fertile virgin soil in the world, and in the main the most favorable climate for the production of large crops, yet it is notorious that the average yield of grain and vegetables in the best cultivated districts is very little greater than the average yield in the rougher thin-soiled States of the East. The reason of this is very obvious to the observing. Instead of thirty to fifty bushels of corn to the acre—which is a pretty good yield in the West—the farmer should raise, every ordinarily favorable season, seventy-five to one hundred bushels. Imperfect cultivation of the soil to begin with, a slap-dash way of planting and caring for the crop, and a most reckless and wasteful system of gathering the harvest, are the prominent characteristics noticeable in prairie husbandry.
