COMBINATION vs. MONOPOLY.

The commercial interests of Puget Sound are daily increasing in magnitude and importance. A carrying trade which, a year ago, was confined to a few lumber vessels, has extended until the substitution of steam for sails is rendered an imperative necessity.

Our purpose in penning this article was to suggest to the merchants on Puget Sound the propriety of entering into a combination for the support of an independent ocean steamer, to ply between the Sound and San Francisco in semi-monthly trips.

The Pacific Mail Co. has grown entirely too impatient on its fat mail contracts to be at all disposed to accommodate our people.

This state of things has continued already too long. It only rests with the merchants of the Sound, combined to say whether it shall longer continue. If they have a proper sense of their interests, they will not be slow to concert some measures to remedy the existing evil.

THE HUDSON BAY COMPANY.

An item of no small import to the people of this town and county appeared in the Herald of the 17th ult. from an eastern paper, relative to the Hudson Bay Co.'s claims in Washington Territory.

The property referred to is that of the Puget Sound Agricultural Company, which comprises some of the best farming and grazing lands in this Territory, and much of which has already been settled upon and improved by our people.

This offer has been made in view of the approaching dissolution of the Company, in May next, and in accordance with the treaty between the United States and Great Britain, in 1845, which recognizes the right of the Company to the lands then occupied by them.

Though the amount demanded is large, (for we think the Company is entitled to pay only for the lands enclosed, with the improvements thereon) yet it would doubtless be cheaper to pay it at once than endeavor to stave it off by a costly diplomacy and legislation, during which the interests of all parties must suffer.

We regard this matter now, however, as very near a settlement. The offer to sell at a specified figure has brought it directly home for adjustment, and adjusted it will unquestionably be soon after the meeting of Congress.

VISIT OF MINERS.—On Tuesday last, several canoe loads of miners, to the number of fifteen or twenty, arrived here direct from Frazer's River. They had a truly poverty-stricken appearance; some being shaggy, others bald, and all more or less ragged.

COUNTY AUDITOR'S REPORT.

To the Honorable County Commissioners of Pierce County, W. T. In accordance with a duty imposed upon me by the statutes governing the duties of my office, I have the honor of submitting to your honorable body an account current of the County of Pierce for the fiscal year ending Sept. 30, 1858.

By the Report of the County Auditor, dated June 4th, 1857, the total indebtedness of the County was \$1,609 58. During the past year the County has received and exchanged County Orders \$4,051 66.

Balance outstanding Sept. 30, 1858, \$1,518 52. It can only be estimated, from the assessment roll so completed, that the County will derive from taxes the present year \$3,000 00. From Licenses \$600 00.

Allowing the expenses for the ensuing year to amount to the sum of \$2000, there will undoubtedly be a favorable balance in the Treasury at the end of the fiscal year 1859. All of which is respectfully submitted.
