PROTECTION TO NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS. 1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary, are considered as wishing to continue their subscription.

PROTECTION TO NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS. 2. If subscribers who have not paid, order their papers stopped, the publisher may continue to send them until paid.

PROTECTION TO NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS. 3. If subscribers refuse or neglect to take their papers from the office, they are held responsible until they have settled the bill, and ceased the paper discontinued.

PROTECTION TO NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS. 4. If subscribers remove to other places without informing the publishers and their papers are continued to the former direction, they can be held responsible.

PROTECTION TO NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS. 5. The Courts have decided that refusing to take a paper from the office, or removing and leaving it unclaimed for is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud on the part of such subscriber.
