ODD-FELLOWSHIP

The following was translated by Mr. Morris Ball, of this city, from the Erz Druid, a German paper, published at Quin

ey, Ill nois:
The Independent Order of Oud Fellows ment to the Masonic Order is that of the O. F. undoubtedly the most widely spread in this country. Many Germans have joined the same, yes, we know that many of our readers are members of the Order, and it will for this reason be agreeable to them, if we should tell them something of the origin and history. of this benevolent Order, in its principle and purposes relative to that of the Druids. Should persons belonging to the one or the other know this already, they will not only not be angry about our communication concerning the subject, but will on the contrary, be thankful to us.

About the age of the Order many fabulous stories are told, for there are many who have the curious idea that an order, unless its ori-A NEW AND EXTENSIVE CONTROL IN CO gin be dated back to antiquity, loses in dignity and appearance. Some of the mos

edging and regarding in man, the man only as such, procured that extraordinary growth

and prosperity for the Order.

In time these lodges increased and united after a more universal system, under the name of the 'United Order of O. F.,' which hed its principal seat in the City of London.

But this did not last very long, and some new reforms were thought necessary For this purpose a meeting of those in favor of the reform was held in Manchester, in the year 1813, on which occasion several of the lodges separated themselves, and formed. at last, the 'Independent Order of O. F.' This new branch progressed very briskly, and from it the Order in the United States, which is now independent for itself, derives its existence.

The proposed commencement of Odd Fel-lowship took place in America in 1819. Serempts to introduce the Orler in the United States had been made prior to this, but they all'failed. Several persons instituted lodges only under their own authority. These lodges, ignorant of the existence of lodges in other cities, were of short duration.

The first lodge of this kind was founded in New York, December 23, 1806, and only lasted until 1822, when it became disorgan-

Another lodge was also founded in New York, in 1816, under the name of the "Reigning Prince" lodgo. The next was the Wash. ington Lodge, No. 1, which was organized in the city of Baltimore, in the year 1819, and only since the opening of this lodge the Order has made a successful beginning in America.

Thomas Wildey was the proper founder of Old Fellowship as now existing in this country. He was an Englishman by birth, and try. He was an Englishman by burn, assettled down in Baltimore, in 1818, Having been a member of the Order for twelve years, and being well acquaintad with the advantage of the besonded to introges and benefits of it, be concluded to intro gee and benefits of it, we consumed to intro-duce the same into the United States. He conferred with another brother, John Welsh, also an Englishman, on the subject, and they came to the conclusion to issue in the diffesent newspapers an invitation to all members which might reside in that neighbo them to assemble at a certain place for the them to assemble at a certain place for the purpose of organizing an Odd Fellow's Lodge. On this occasion, besides the two above mentioned, J. Duncan, John Chatham and Richard Rushworth mat and segment of the 26th of April, 1819, the Washington Lodge, No. 1. The founders now applied for a regular charter from England, which was also given to them I y the "Duke of York" Ledge. Preston, Manchester Union, by means of which they received the right to give charters to other lodges. They received the same October 23, 1820. Soon afterwards Frankin Lodge No. 2 was organized. The P. G.s of these two lodges subsequently formed a Grand Lodge of Maryland and the United States, to which on the 22d of February, 1821, Washington Lodge delivered its full authority. T. Wildey was the first Grand Master. On the 15th of May, 1826, this Grand Lodge re-ceived a charter from the highest authority perved a charter from the inguest autority in Great Britain, in which the document given by the "Duke of York" Lodge was confirmed and mentioned as a Grand Lodge, authorized to conduct the business affairs of


