The timber on the low-lands is generally hard-wood which commands upon the river bank from \$2 50 to \$2 75 per cord. That on the uplands is generally fir, which can be rafted to the mills upon the river and always find a ready market. This, too, is that speci of fir so highly prized by ship-builders for maste and spars. And there is not the same extent of country upon the Pacific coast where such facilities are presented for ship-ping them as here. There is not a quarter f a mile in extent along the whole water front of the County where the largest clipper ship cannot come right along the shore and take in her load without either wharfs or

The soil along the river bank is a light sandy loam, and certainly is unsurpassed in fertility. Wheat, rye, oats, barley and hay are the principal crops and those that pay the best. The average yield of wheat on low lands is from 35 to 40 bushels per acre—oats from 55 to 60, and hay from 21 to 3 tons per acre. A person can go to work here and get for

his month's labor during the winter months \$30 per month in currency and his board. Say tout he works six months, he then bus this land and with the remaining \$80 30 head of sheep. He can go to work clearing the land, and the wood he cutsoff it will be wurth if hard \$2 per cord, if fir \$1 50, for which there is roady galo. He can average his core and a-half of hard wood per day and clear o He can average his cord "slash" three acres por month, which will give him eighteen acres cleared land in one season, and put into his pocket at least \$100. The sheep will keep down the brush and sprouts, and in three years' time there will not be a stump on any of the land he has "slashed." For the truth of this any one has only to go on the farms of the Christs', Judge Douthit, Jamison, Love or Bean. Or if he has upland that has fir timber on it, Lewis river drains a country to the extent of at least 80 miles, and on which he can raft logs to a good advantage, and just across the Columbia at its mouth he can deliver his raft and get the highest cash price for his logs. Or he can go on salmon Creek and raft for eighter ten miles from its mouth; or go above and furnish the mills, of which there are four on that stream, viz : Marble's, Patterson's, Campbell's, Thornton & Leisar's. The great solar colines which took place August 7th, and to which the scientists of the world were looking forward with interest, renders anything on the subject of special present interest. We present some extracts from a paper in the Cornhill Magazine, en-titled "Great Solur Edipses:"

"The first impertant cellipse whose records have reached us is that which occurred in the year 584 s.c. It took place, Herndotty relates, while the Medog and Lydians were an agged in battle. He thus describes the occurrence: The war had continued between the two two nations with balanced success for five years. In the sight year of the war another battle took took place; and after both sides had fought without advantage, and when the engagement was grawing warm, the day was sudden't turned into might. Of course it is impossible to doubt that a total collipse of the sun, and not the mere concealment of the sun under a cloud, was the cause of the city's capture.
