The Report of the Tariff Commission, respecting such as much has been heard the past few months, may be summed up in the phrase "much cry and little wool."

From a circular issued by the Commercial Agency of R. G. Dana, New York, we learn that the business failures in Washington Territory during 1882 numbered twenty, with the aggregate liabilities placed at \$128,300; in 1881 there were twelve failures with only \$99,690 liabilities; in 1880 there were 13 failures, liabilities \$80,588; in 1879 there were 58 failures, liabilities \$171,365; in 1878 there were 3 failures, liabilities \$16,900; and in 1877 there were 7 failures and liabilities aggregating \$27,800.
