Democratic National Address. WASHINGTON, March 5, 1877. At a caucus of the democratic members of the House of Representatives, held on the 31st of March, 1877, in the hall of the House, the following address was unanimously adopted:

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Was Ever Fraud Like This?—The closing paragraphs of David D. Field's argument in the Florida case, before the Electoral Commission, are impressively eloquent. He said:

Such, Mr. President and gentlemen of the Commission, is as brief a statement as I can make of the facts, and the law as we understand them to-day. The greatness of the question in respect to the dignity of the Presidential office, and the enormous interests depending upon it, are as nothing compared with the moral elements involved. True it is that the person to whom you give your decision will be for four years Chief Magistrate of forty five millions of people; will be Commander in Chief of your army and navy; the organ between you and all foreign States; the bestower of all offices; the fountain of honor and power, and the executor of your law. But that is as nothing compared with the greater question, whether or not the American people stand powerless before a mighty fraud. Here is the certificate [holding it aloft in his hand]. One feels almost reluctant to touch it. It is black with crime. Pass it around, let every man see it; and then tell me whether or not that certificate gives a title to an office contrary to truth, as we can prove it. One of the greatest poets of the palmist days of English literature, writing of the coming of the Savior, said:

"An ancient fraud shall fall, Retaining justice left aloft her scale." "Ancient fraud? Was there ever fraud like this? In all previous ages fraud has succeeded only because it has been backed by the sword, and protesting people have been powerless to resist the force of armed battalions. Never, before now in the history of the world has a fraud succeeded against the conscience and the will of a self governing people. If it succeeds now let us take down the statue on the dome of the Capitol which every morning faces the coming light. Let us clothe ourselves in sackcloth and sit in ashes forever."

Jefferys in England disgraced the ermine, but it remained for the American judges to so soil the judicial robes as to make them the badge of disgrace. Until thoroughly renovated, the Supreme Court of the United States will be a stench in the nostrils of every honest man.

Treatment of Diphtheria. A Chicago physician writes of his treatment of diphtheria, as follows: "I immediately on its appearance I place the patient, if he be an adult, on twenty-grain doses of the chloride dissolved in water, and administered every half hour for the first six hours, after which the dose is reduced to ten grains, and the medicine is continued until the throat is free from the membrane. The dissolved salt should be held in the throat a few seconds before swallowing it. When the sub-lingual spots begin to appear on the throat a solution of nitrate of silver of the strength of one ounce of water, applied by a camel's hair brush, is usually all that is necessary. I keep the nostrils free, and cleanse them from the obstructing secretions by frequently irrigating them with a saturated solution of chloride of zinc, which keeps the throat moist, allows the patient to breathe freely, and acts as a sedative fomentation within the nostrils. This treatment, aided by strong, nourishing diet—very salt beef tea—and attention to the stomach and bowels, has proven with me an absolute specific for diphtheria. Although I treat great numbers of cases, I have not had in my practice a death from the disease in years."
