FROM THE FAR EAST. What Our New York Coroner Thinks of Walls. Extracts from an Article in the New York Graphic.

In the Graphic of March 6th is published a column article in relation to Walls Walla from which we make some interesting extracts.

Upon receiving the word from Capt. McGrover—Opinions of Old Settlers in regard to the gathering of the Indians—Belief that it is a False Alarm.

As per instructions Capt. McGrover, one of the bravest and most experienced officers at the garrison, left last night about five o'clock on a special for the Willows Station, and from there he will cross the river and proceed to Alder Creek to investigate the cause of the rumors of an Indian outbreak.

At a late hour last evening General Grover, commander of Walla Walla Post received the following telegram from Captain McGrover, who was detailed to Alder Creek to investigate the Indian troubles reported by Postmaster Sheppy, and over which such a commotion has been raised:

War Topples. This morning Wm. O'Donnell, our popular hardware merchant, received through Wells, Fargo & Co., a package marked to him and containing by Col. Marshall. After depositing a dollar and a half for storage, he proceeded to investigate his package and found it to contain two tuffs of coal-black horse hair, severely glued upon circular pieces of paper, and supposed to represent Indian scalps.
