Platform of the National Grange

Adopted by the National Grange, at its Seventh Annual Session. PREAMBLE. Profoundly impressed with the truth that the National Grange of the United States should have for its platform a declaration of principles, we have organized to make this Declaration of Purpose of the Patrons of Husbandry:

1. United by the strong and faithful ties of agriculture, we have organized to protect the rights of our order, our country and mankind. 2. We heartily endorse the motto: "In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity."

3. We shall endeavor to advance our cause by following to accomplish the following objects: To develop a better and higher quality of farm products, and to secure the best market for them. To protect the interests of our members, and to strengthen our attachments to our country.

4. For our business interests, we desire to bring producers and consumers of farm products into closer relations with each other. Hence we must dispense with a surplus middle man, but that we are not to do so, we do not need them. Their surplus and their exactions diminish our profits.

5. We emphatically and sincerely assert the oppressed truth taught in our constitution, that no individual or party has the right to monopolize the land, the labor, or the commerce of our country. We are opposed to excessive salaries, high rates of interest and exorbitant prices of profits in trade.

6. Ours being peculiarly a farmers' institution, we cannot admit all to our ranks. Many are excluded by the nature of our organization, not because they are professional men, or agriculturists, but because they have not a sufficient interest in the success of the order.

7. It shall be an abiding principle with us to rely on our own strength and suffering brotherhood by any means to assist in the destruction of the order. Last, but not least, we proclaim it among our purposes to include a proper appreciation of the ability and talents of our members, by admitting them to membership and position in our order.
