DOUBLE MURDER. We are indebted to the Sentinel, published at Union, Union county, Oregon, for the following particulars of a most fearful tragedy.

DOUBLE MURDER. About one o'clock on the morning of the 15th inst., there was perpetrated, in front of Chaney's hotel in our town, one of the most cowardly attempts to commit a double murder that ever darkened the criminal records of the Pacific coast.

DOUBLE MURDER. The facts as near as we can gather them are about as follows: John P. Sullivan and wife were returning home from a party given at the Centennial hotel in company with Mrs. Sullivan's mother.

DOUBLE MURDER. In response to the sheriff's query if he had used it, he said: "Yes, I've used it, you will find out in the morning what I have done."

DOUBLE MURDER. Mr. and Mrs. Sullivan are both well known in our county. Mr. Sullivan being the proprietor of an extensive saddlery and harness establishment here.

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CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. Down in Oregon, the usual salutation is: "When are you going to the Palouse country?"

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. The boot is on the other foot now, and a terrible howl is raised. American Indians are on the warpath in Mexico, committing all manner of depredations in the true Indian fashion.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. When the war began the Czar was sad, because he believed he would not live to be sixty. But on the 29th of April he passed his birthday. So that a Romanoff may become sixty.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. Mr. Hayes is thinning the population of the penitentiaries pretty rapidly. Two hundred and forty-five pardons during the first year of his administration is an extensive exercise of the de facto clemency.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. During the year seventy-four million pieces of tracts were distributed by the American Tract Society, and the receipts were over four hundred thousand dollars. The tracts cost less than fifty thousand dollars.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. A poker-player in Omaha declared that he hoped to be struck dead if he had had about the cards; and he was struck dead an instant after the words were out of his mouth. Providence is evidently determined to purify this noble game.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. Japan has had one hundred and forty-nine destructive earthquakes during the last fifteen hundred years. The lesser ones are innumerable. This interesting information is sent by Minister Bingham, who, while in congress, was humorously described as "the gathered wisdom of a thousand years."

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. If the republicans, simply because they had the power, presumed, in defiance of a popular majority of a quarter of a million, and of a decided electoral majority, to declare Hayes and Wheeler elected, they cannot without admitting that the democrats are both more honest and less given to revenge than themselves, expect that the democrats will not follow the precedent set them when a democratic congress comes to count the electoral votes of 1880.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. THE FOOT AND THE POUND.—The foot and the pound are found in every country, and have evidently been derived directly from the Romans. But they can claim a far higher antiquity, for Mr. Chisholm traces their origin to the Babylonians, or Chaldeans, who, as units of length, used both the cubit and the foot. These were subsequently adopted by the Egyptians, who introduced considerable variety, so that there is no confusion between the different kinds of cubit and foot. The natural cubit, of about eighteen inches, and the foot, which was two-thirds of this length, were transferred to Greece, and the cubic having fallen into disuse, the foot became the ordinary standard of the Romans. At the same time the double cubit, which was equivalent to three feet, would appear to have survived in the form of the ell of medieval Europe, and in that of our own yard. As all these measures were originally derived from the proportions of the human body, some caution is necessary in referring their origin to remote antiquity rather than directly to the length of the forearm or of the foot. It must be admitted, however, that the coincidence of length among the civilized nations is very striking. The derivation of the pound weight is more complicated. The earlier Tower pound appears to have been of Roman origin, being presumably identical with the Greek-Asiatic mina, while the hundred weight corresponded to the talent, or weight of a cubic foot of water. Subsequently the Troy pound was substituted, and, for commercial transactions, the pound avoirdupois, from the old French pound of sixteen ounces. It is evident, however, that our weights and measures in the dark ages were in an unsettled state, and subject to arbitrary alterations at the will of the monarch.—Review.

CURRENT NEWS ITEMS. WEBSTER'S DISAPPOINTMENT.—Mr. Webster is reported to have said to a friend that although he knew that he had a poor reputation to leave to posterity, yet if he were to live his life over again, he would, upon no consideration whatever, permit himself to enter public life. The man who serves them most faithfully receives no adequate reward. Do your duty, he added, as a private citizen, but let politics alone. It is probable that he said this substantially as it is reported, for there was never a more bitterly disappointed public man. Toward the end of his life there was almost a gloomy melancholy in his aspect. At the completion of the Erie railroad, in 1851, as secretary of state he accompanied president Fillmore and a very distinguished party of public men on an excursion along the road from New York to Dunkirk, and upon reaching Dunkirk he spoke from a platform in the street. During the speech the Easy Chair, who was a spectator, observed that the sun was setting just behind Mr. Webster as he stood erect, his gray hair lifted by the breeze, his great head and sombre, mournful face drawn against the illuminated spectacle. A little later the national convention of his party passed him by and nominated another candidate for the presidency. Still a broken hearted man, he was generally felt, because he had not only, it was believed, because he had failed to receive the "adequate reward," but because of some things he had been willing to do to obtain it. On the evening of the 6th of March, 1850, the orator at Plymouth Rock said to a friend and member of congress, who told the Easy Chair, "to-morrow I am going to annihilate you—abolitionists."—Harp-er's Magazine.

News of the Day.

Mr. Chandler, of Illinois, goes to Idaho as surveyor general. In the territorial asylum there are now 72 patients, 58 males and 14 females.

Maine's Greenbackers will endeavor to settle the universe, June 3. The Emperor of Russia still holds out for war with England, and will not yield a single point.

It is to be hoped that the efforts of certain Oregon papers to stir up an Indian war will not be successful. The Nez Perces prisoners at Fort Leavenworth have petitioned to be liberated, promising to be good Indians.

It is reported that an earthquake recently occurred in Venezuela, by which six hundred persons were killed. In San Francisco the German-speaking section of the Workingmen's party have repudiated Kearney.

The British squadron on the Pacific station is to be reinforced by the turret-ship Thunders and the corvette Tenedos. Prince Louis Napoleon was drawn for service in the French army.

The steamship California, recently built at Philadelphia, for the Oregon trade, has been sold to the Russian government. James B. Mix of Rochester has informed a correspondent that Mrs. Tilton's confession is part of a conspiracy, and that Beecher is innocent of the crime charged.

A marriage at common law is valid, no matter what the state or territorial statutes provide. At least the United States Supreme court says so. Over seven feet of water fell on the Russian River valley, California, since November last.

Deadwood keeps up its reputation as the murderer's paradise. Scarcely a day passes without one or more shooting rapes, and in the majority of instances both of the combatants get killed.

A gentleman, who a few days ago traveled over the Dalles and Sandy wagon road, states that wagons can pass from Portland to the lower end of the Cascades, and that the road is an excellent one and in good condition.

Arizona and this territory are absorbing most of the idle element of California. Late advices indicate that there are but few idle men outside of San Francisco, and the most of those seem to prefer poverty in the city to plenty in the country.

The Army Bill.

The army bill, as reported from the house appropriation committee, is likely to meet with bitter opposition, and the probabilities are that it will fail.

The president is authorized to discharge from the service officers on their own application or before January 1 next, and every officer who has been in the service two years shall be entitled to receive, in addition to the pay and allowances due him on the date of his discharge, one year's pay.

The pay proper of the officers has not been changed. The allowance for constructive forage has been abolished. The allowance for quarters one-half, and for fuel two-thirds of the old rates.

Those who are insantly talking about reducing the army would do well to remember what must be apparent to all, that communism is increasing rapidly in all of the large cities of this country, and in order to suppress it an increased force will be required.
