CONGRESSIONAL.

The House then went into Committee of the Whole on the Tax bill. The amendment offered last night exempted from special tax, dealers in unmanufactured lumber and breadstuffs.

Mr. Sumner moved a reconsideration of the vote on the passage of the bill admitting the rebel States to allow Mr. Yates to make a speech.

Mr. Sumner then withdrew the motion and the bill to continue the freedman's bureau was taken up.

Mr. Hendricks got the floor and spoke in opposition to the bill. He characterized it as an attempt to continue political domination, saying the people will condemn that as well as the other reconstruction measures.

The bill relieving the political disabilities of Roderick A. Butler, of Tennessee, was taken up. The Committee on Judiciary reported a substitute releasing him from disabilities and requiring as a pre-requisite to holding office an oath simply to support the Constitution of United States and give full allegiance to the same.

In the House, at 3 o'clock, the committee rose to allow Mr. Butler to offer the following resolution:

Resolved, That Chas. W. Wooley, having appeared before Committee of Investigation and answered all questions and thus purged himself of contentment of the House, be discharged from arrest.

Mr. Butler added that the witness had answered fully and distinctly all the questions put to him. The resolution was adopted.

The Senate amendment to the bill to admit the States of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Alabama to represent in Congress, were referred to the Committee on Reconstruction.

Washington, June 12.—The President today nominated to the Senate Reverdy Johnson as Minister to England, James Corry as Collector of internal revenue for the first district of California, Alex. J. Moher as United States Attorney for Montana and B. F. Dennison as the Associate Justice of the Supreme Court for Washington Territory.

FENIAN MATTERS. Montreal, June 12.—A seizure of arms at St. Albans, yesterday, by the United States Government is reported.

Toronto, June 12.—The Globe professes to have information, on authority beyond dispute, that the Fenian movement upon Canada has actually commenced and that their forces are being gradually concentrated at Buffalo and other points.

Buffalo, June 13.—The reports from Canada having gained circulation to the effect that the Fenians are concentrating at this point for a raid on the neighboring Province, it is proper to contradict such statements.
