FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATION.—It will be seen from the report, that the Mayor and City Council have taken the preliminary steps looking towards a celebration of the ever glorious Fourth. The time for preparation is rather brief, but with proper exertion, we believe that arrangements can be made for a celebration that will speak well for the patriotism of our people.

On motion, Messrs. Koblhauff and Brown were appointed on the part of the Council, to see with Messrs. Barrett, Coleman and Frank, a special committee to raise a subscription to defray the cost of the celebration of the 4th of July, 1867.

On motion, the matter of an appropriation from the city treasury, was deferred until next regular meeting.
