It has become a subject of considerable comment in this community as to our position on the liquor question—whether or not we are in favor of low license.

We claim that a business that the Congress of these United States has seen fit to legalize for a period extending over one hundred years, is wholly out of the jurisdiction of a petty municipal government.

Our position then is very plain; low license but high bonds and a strict enforcement of the law. Any man can come here prepared to pay a \$1,000 license and what is to prevent him from opening out a most respectable place?

But if a low drive keeper were to attempt to secure bonds in the sum of \$5,000, with good and responsible sureties, could that not be so readily accomplished?

But a municipal government has the right to frame restrictive measures in the way of bonds; put them as high as you wish; the more respectable the saloon may be, the more he can raise as a surety that he will conduct a respectable house.

We have now fully defined our position, and we will stand up to it; in favor of equal taxation, but equally in favor of restriction in the form of high and responsible bonds.

The most plausible hypothesis is that suggested by Prof. Pottenger, of Munich—that it is elaborated in ponds of shallow soil; which agrees well with the fact that most of the great cholera epidemics have originated, and the disease has become endemic in the delta of the Ganges.
