Garfield's Demise.

ELBERON, Sept. 19th, 10:35, P. M.—The President died at 10:35, P. M. Death was caused by severe prostration. Warren Young, Assistant to the President's private Secretary, Brown, brought the news from the cottage at 10 minutes before 11 o'clock. The first indication that anything serious had occurred, was in the appearance of an messenger at the Elberon Hotel, who obtained a carriage and drove rapidly off. It was generally supposed that he had left to summon the members of the Cabinet, who left here at about 11:30 to-night.

Official Notification.

ELBERON, Sept. 19.—Attorney General McVeagh notified Vice President Arthur of Gen. Garfield's demise.

The Cabinet.

11:15, P. M.—The Cabinet have just arrived. They came in a body to Franklin Cottage. They are all here except Secretary Blaine. Lincoln and McVeagh telegraphed him of the President's death. Great excitement prevails through the East, and particulars cannot be obtained.

The Guard around the Cottage where the President's body lies has been doubled.

The Chicago Times correspondent has furnished his paper with the following graphic description of the death bed scene. As Brown entered the room Mrs. Rockwell and Mrs. Lulu, who had just come in with Mrs. Garfield and Mollie left the room and stood in the hall outside the grief-stricken man stood at the head of the bed feeling the pulse and Dr. Agnew and Hamilton were trying to revive the president with hypodermic injections of brandy. Col. Rockwell went out for a moment and returned with Mollie Garfield. As the president passed into a sinking condition he began to breathe with great slow gasps. Col. Rockwell went quickly to the window and the doctor then turned to Mrs. Garfield, who leaned upon him as the president slowly breathed his last. Mrs. Garfield was calm save for convulsive shudders that at times overmastered her. The little girl sobbed bitterly and her weeping and the president's gasping breath were the only sounds in the room.

The Immediate Cause.

The president's death was immediately caused by a trouble of the heart supposed to be neuralgia.

The Notification.

The following dispatch was sent to Gen. Arthur by Secretaries Blaine and Lincoln from Long Branch:

10:20 A. M.—VICE-PRESIDENT ARTHUR.

It becomes our painful duty to inform you of the death of President Garfield. We advise you to take the oath of office of the president of the United States without delay, and if it occurs with your judgment we will be very glad if you will come here on the earliest train to-morrow morning.

Too Sad.
