THE NEW MINES.

A Sensible Writer—The Mines Not New—The Route to get in—Difficulties of Mining—Quartz Abundant—Encouraging Reports, Etc.

Huron, M. T., Nov. 6.

This railroad mining town in the mountains has somewhat of a boom on hand at present. The town consists of three general merchandise stores, three hotels, four restaurants, six saloons, all doing a good business, two dwelling houses, and a number of buildings belonging to the railroad company.

No part of the country has been thoroughly prospected as yet. Most all writers are timid in writing about the mineral prospects of the country, for fear of being charged with trying to create a false excitement.

The idea that the Cour d'Alene mining district is a new one lately discovered is not a fact. It has been known to a number of old prospectors for many years, and a few have held claims there for the last eight or ten years.

One point greatly in favor of the Cour d'Alene district is that it is a very large one. Prospectors are not confined to one small creek, gold being found in paying quantities on most every creek and gulch running into the Pritchard creek, and on other creeks heading in that section.

The Northern Pacific gives notice that it has decided to allow 150 pounds of first-class baggage with every first-class ticket, both on through and local business.

Reductions are continuing to be made in the various departments of the road, both as regards fare and salary. These, however, are made necessary by the consolidation of the two divisions of the road.

Every day there are encouraging reports coming from the mines. Men are starting here daily and preparing to go into the mines over the new trail.

Coal has been found in paying quantities four miles north of Pendleton, on the hills. The gentleman found it while digging a well.

J. A. Farrell, time-keeper on the railroad between here and Blue Mountain, says the road-bed will be ready for track laying in six weeks.

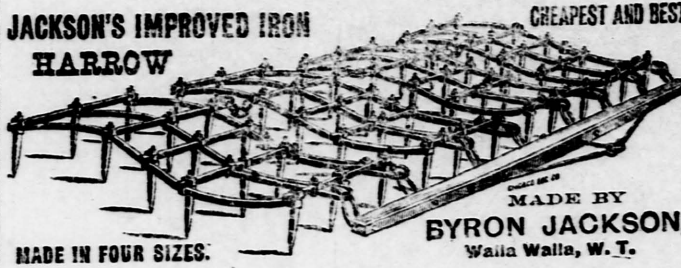

Free Scholarships. The University Free Scholarship bill, introduced in the Council (No. 55) by Mr. Edmonson, of Columbia county, reads as follows:

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Washington: SECTION 1. That it shall be lawful for the appointment and establishment of thirty-five free scholarships in the Territorial University, the appointments to be made as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. That each Councilman of the Legislative Assembly shall have authority to appoint one person to a scholarship from his Council district, and each Representative in the House of Representatives of the Legislative Assembly shall have authority to appoint one person to a scholarship from the county or district represented by him; provided, that should there be found no qualified person in any Council or Representative district desiring to accept a free scholarship in said University, after due and reasonable notice given by the Councilman or Representative of said district, then said appointments may be made from any other portion of the Territory.

SECTION 3. That no person shall be appointed to or hold a free scholarship in said University who at the time of his or her appointment is under fourteen years of age, or who shall not have been a bona fide resident of the territory at least six months prior to the date of said appointment.

SECTION 4. Every appointment made under the provisions of this act shall be in the duplicate form, one copy of which shall be mailed and addressed to the Territorial Auditor, and filed in his office, and the other copy sent to the Secretary of the Board of Regents of the University within ten days after date of said appointment.

SECTION 5. At the close of each quarter of the school term the appointment of persons or more scholarships to the University shall prepare and file in the office of the Territorial Auditor a tabular statement showing the names, age, residence, date of appointment and by whom appointed, and the name of his parents or guardian of each person holding a free scholarship in said University.

SECTION 6. Any scholarship made under the provisions of this act shall entitle the holder thereof to two years' free tuition to said University or not less than nine months in each year in separate terms of three months each.

SECTION 7. Any vacancy by resignation, death, expulsion or removal from the territory in any appointment of scholarship under the provisions of this act may be filled by appointment of the unexpired term of said scholarship by the Councilman or Representative making such appointment.

SECTION 8. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its approval.
