Death of J. O. Scott.

On Friday evening about 8 o'clock, J. O. Chaplain Mepple's Case.

The judge advocates general of the army transmitted the proceedings in the controversial case of Chaplain Touissant Mepple to the Secretary of War, together with his report upon the case. Chaplain Mepple was charged with duplicating his pay accounts, and with absence without leave. The sentence of the court was dismissal. The judge advocate general, in his review of the case, it is understood, indicates everything regular, and takes no exception to the proceedings or findings. In recommending the dismissal of Mepple, the court made a recommendation for clemency, and this may result in mitigating his punishment to a considerable extent.

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Washington Letter.

[FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT.]

WASHINGTON, November 27, 1883. Ere this letter is in type you will probably have seen some light on the question who is to be the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and I will therefore keep near the shore and avoid predictions.

The Democrats are thoroughly imbued with a feeling of the importance of prudence and caution. They desire to avoid the blunders which the Republicans are so anxious they shall commit. It must be confessed their way is beset by dangers, but on the other hand they are strong in able and tried leaders.

Quite a number of Democratic Senators have arrived in the city and have secured homes for the winter. I have talked with a number of them and have learned that there is a general and very earnest wish that the Ohio Legislature shall return Ex-Senator Thurman to the Senate.

The Democrats of that body feel the loss of his wise leadership, his immense legal learning, and acquaintance with affairs. The minority in the Senate is not lacking in ability but it has never before had a leader who possessed in such an eminent and acknowledged degree the power to counsel, decide, combine, and control as Allen G. Thurman.

The Senate this winter will contain thirty members who have served also in the House of Representatives which is a large proportion when it is considered there are only seventy-eight Senators in all.

There is not difficult even this early in the season to see a dozen Presidential possibilities in Washington. One of the latest arrivals is Judge Holman, of Indiana, who is here with his wife and two daughters.
