The Mines.

The Powder river mines, notwithstanding the vociferous cry of humbug raised a few weeks since by men who returned without even attempting to make a fire examination of the country, promise to yield a bountful remuneration to the industrious miner. It is fortunate for the country that there is in every crowd of gold adventurera a few energetic, persevering men—men who exhibit as much discretion and good sense in respect to prapecting for gold as they do in the other vocations of life. To such men we are indebted for the discovery and development of our sources of wealth, while the indolent and less persevering class return to their sluggish pursuits and habits, and cry down the movement which requires but faithful prosecution to ensure success. Thus it not unfrequently happens that the very men who were loudest in unfounded denunciations of a particular mining section, return the same senson, or perhapa the next, to reap the fruits of other mensilahor. If other men will prospect and establish the fact of the existence of paying mines, and find claims for them, they will generally muster upenergy renough to work them in their peculiar way.

As we have believed from the first, good pay-

As we have believed from the first, good paying gold mines exist in the Powder river country, and we are daily receiving evidences in confirmation of this belief. From Mr. Barnett, who arrived on Saturday last, we learn that Mr. Kirkpairiek and party, consisting of three men, are averaging 80 per day, running one string of sluice Messes. Littlefield and Griffin are averaging from 810 to 820 per day. The diggings at Auburn, the new town site spoken of in our last, promise to yield fair wages. Wilson's Guleh continues to yield fair wages. Wilson's Guleh continues to yield well. Gordon and company, on a newly discovered guleh, are averaging about eight dollars per day to the hand. Althrugh there are still many embarrassments in the way of effective prospecting, new discoveries are being reported every day. Fine gold diggings have been found which will yield an ounce per day by the use of quicksilver.

We learn that the town is rapidly building up, lets are held at very high figures, business of all kinds is active, and procisions and mining implements are abundant at reasonable prices. A resident of this city who recently returned from Florence, informs us that he offered four thousand dollars for a small log house and lot in that place, or four hundred dollars per month rent, neither of which offers was accepted. THE COUNTRY.—A drive in the country, over the bounding prairie and across the pebble-bedded streams, among the farms and grazing stock, is at this season of the year a peculiarly pleasant retreat from the business pursuits of life. A few days ago we got into a carriage, took the reins of a span of noble steeds, and drove into the country to see what it looked like. We found here and there, at a d stance of a mile or more separated, farm-houses comfortable and uncomtortable, built in yeary variety of style and with all sorts of misterial—all of them at this time, however, possessing an air of cherfulness in too follegance. There is considerable thrift manifest in gardening, and we noticed some fine young orchards, but we should say that farming in the Walla Walla valley, with few exceptions, is in an embryo condition; and such appendages to dwell ngs as out-buildings—barns, granaries, sheets, &c.—are seldom met with. It is true, we should not expect to find these useful adjuncts to farming as numerous as we would in an older settled country; but it seems to us that barns in which the proceeds of the farm may be husbanded, are as necessary to successful farming as a house to live in. A simple log cabin, without out-buildings or fences, situated upon a vast tract of prairie land, furnishes a rather dreary picture, and in an agricultural point of view is to say the least not very promising. However, as materials for building and fencing become more plentiful in the valley, we hope and expect to see them used in the erection of cosy farm houses with their array of necessary out-buildings.

FORCE PUMPS .- We notice that some of or Force Punts.—We notice that some of our citizens are securing these valuable safe-guards in the prevention of fires. Mr. Kohlhauff, of this city, the other day called our attention to the design of a force pump recently purchased by his partner in San Francisco, for their houses here, which seems to be an improvement in the article. It is competent to throw a good size stream over the highest buildings, and works easily and readily. There is some talk among our business men of securing one of these for each block in the city, and we hope it may be done. They furnish a safeguard at all times, may be speedily set in operation, and in case of a fire, would be found to be a valuable auxiliary to the fire engine.

Concord Coaches.—These "institutions" are becoming extremel fashionable in this neighborhood, having recently succeeded the old-fashioned mud-wagons on all the roads leading out from this city. We noticed our friend Abbott the other morning driving a team of six fine horses before one of them, and the entire establishment presented a business appearance, besides one of decided elegance. We recommend our lower country friends to take a trip up the Columbia to the "Old Fort," and thence to this place for the very purpose of taking a ride in one of Abbott's coaches.

Freeze-out is a gaming operation, but is not laid down in Hoyle's book of games, nor is it mentioned in any treaties on chess, poker, brag or monte. Freeze-out, as we understand it, is where a panying joint-stock association, or company, form some rich, some poor members. The rich members cominine against their poor co-partners to deprive them of their capital or shares in

Freezeout, then, is what, at draughts, is called a game of "give away." Its operation is for the large fish of the company to devour the minnows and mussels of the shoals. It is a breach of trust. It any ionit stately company. breach of trust. In any joint-stock compa-ny it requires but slight perversions of the figures of arithmetic to tra sfer profits into losses, calling for assessments to balance

rosses, catting for assessments to balance the ledger.

The game of freeze-out is practised extensively on 'change in large cities. A capitalist oning in steamboat or railroad stocks will throw his shares into market, and sell at less than the intrinsic value to pill the stock down. He is then called by stock-blokers a "bear." After this he purchases at low prices, and makes sham sales at high prices, to toss up the same stock. He is then called a "bull." "Bulls" and "Bears" are public a sindlers, and are the bane and poison of all public enterprises. Legislatures have attempted to frame laws to punish their frauds, but have never succeeded. The only safety for associated wealth is to keep their stock away from brokers' auctions.

There is sometimes a principle of anti-freeze out which is ruinous to companies; this is where individuals take up mining claims and are unable to work them, and are un-silling to sell any shares to enable work to go on. By this the mine is kept idle and the stock is very near worthless, for want of the right kind of shareholders to develop the mine. This is a "dog in the manger" policy, which injures stockholders and the community.
