The Rich Yakima Lands to be Beautifully Watered.

Development Work in the Great Valley in Progress and its Prospects.

The tourist on sailing into the magnificent harbor of Seattle, and from the deck of one of our stately floating palaces, viewing that growing, beautiful commercial emporium.
