STANLEY IN OMAHA.

A Chapter From His Early Newspaper Career. His Love Affair.

In the year 1866 Stanley was sent out to the western country by the New York Herald to report the war then raging with the Nez Perces.

No matter what danger, no matter what risk of losing his life he may have to undergo, he bravely carried his account right through a country that was practically in the hands of hostile Indians.

Directly after his arrival here he took up with a woman of the town who went by the name of Annie Riley, and eventually succeeded in furthering Stanley's desire to dispose of his surplus cash.

This condition of affairs ran along almost all the winter, but early in the spring Stanley received word from the Herald that he should report immediately, as he was wanted—that they were going to send him to report the Grecian war, which was then raging.

He was sent to Greece, as history relates, and an incident happened in that country that made him the redoubtable explorer he is to-day.

For some time after this nothing was heard from him, with the exception of several letters written to friends in this country in which he avowed his intention of doing something that would shed a luster about his name.

It was not a long period after this that the report that a daring young man named Stanley was going as the representative of the New York Herald to make an attempt to discover the whereabouts of Livingstone, who, it was thought, had lost his way in the Dark Continent.

At last a messenger arrived at Cairo, Egypt, which brought news of the safety of the travelers, as well as a brief but vivid account of the trials and hardships endured by Stanley and his party.
