America needs our action NOW!

Our Medicare and social security system are already in financial trouble, and government healthcare for Veterans is sorely inadequate. In spite of this, the Democrats have just passed a 2600 page Healthcare Reform bill that will take over 1/6 of our economy, contains \$2.5 trillion in government spending and collects taxes for 3 years prior to beginning the program. Yes Virginia, there is a Santa Claus and it is YOU—the taxpayer!

Democrats ignore Republican budget reforms

As I write this letter, we are on day eight of the special session. The 2010 regular session ended on March 11, but the governor called a special session so majority Democrats in the House and Senate could have more time to finalize their operating budget and tax increase proposals. While we do not know the details of the final budget, we know it will rely heavily on tax increases, federal bailout dollars, one-time fund transfers, and state reserves. This is an unsustainable approach that will lead to more problems. It is also clear tax increases will approach \$1 billion.

Both legislative sessions will be remembered for their failures to restructure state government, reform the budget process and hold the line on tax increases. At a time when families, individuals and small businesses are struggling, it is unfortunate majority Democrats and the governor chose to preserve the status quo in Olympia.

I joined my Republican colleagues in offering solutions to address our state's problems. We provided ideas to prioritize state government to focus on education, public safety and the protection of our most vulnerable. These concepts include: reforming the Basic Health Plan; privatizing state liquor stores; and offering competition in our workers' compensation insurance system. All of our ideas were rejected.

We also introduced budget reforms that would have: required exceptional state revenue to be deposited into the "rainy day fund" during good economic times; prohibited the governor or Legislature from proposing an operating budget deemed unsustainable; required the Legislature to adopt a balanced budget; and established a state spending limit. These reforms were not allowed to move forward.

Finally, House Republicans offered a jobs plan that would have helped employers of all sizes through regulatory relief, health care reform and the assurance of clean, low-cost energy. Again, nearly all of our bills were ignored.

I truly feel the citizens of Washington, from all along the political spectrum, are upset with out-of-control government spending and understand that one-party control of Olympia has failed. Our state must do better, and I look forward to working with you to accomplish this goal.



Expressway to serfdom

If we learn anything from the 2010 Legislative session, it is this: We live in dangerous times. The insatiable appetite of the "Progressive" agenda should have us all increasingly concerned for our state and our way of life.

The majority party is determined to raise taxes and increase state programs even in a recession. In fact, this year they instituted \$338 million in spending on *new* programs.

To pay for this, they intend to end a host of legitimate tax incentives designed to keep Washington businesses competitive in the marketplace. If taken far enough, it logically follows that "tax loopholes" exist simply to allow industry and its employees to survive at whatever level the bureaucracy thinks is best.

As citizens of Washington, we must realize that our freedoms and liberty are being eroded day by day. For that reason, we must do whatever it takes to stop this dismantling of the free market system – before it's too late.






