This supplement accompanies the third edition of **Go West Young Reader** which was issued in November 2006. These are the children and young adult books set in Washington and the Northwest acquired by the Washington State Library since the publication of that 58-page bibliography.

The **Go West Young Reader** bibliographies are the result of Washington State Librarian Jan Walsh's seasonal *Washington Reads* program. Ms. Walsh launched the program in fall 2003 on the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the arrival of the Territorial Library books in Olympia. Each subsequent quarter Ms. Walsh chooses a theme and selects at least one adult, one young adult, and one children's book as part of her *Washington Reads* program. This list continues to grow as the State Library seeks and purchases more children and young adult books for its Northwest collection.

The call numbers for many of these items are in the process of being updated. Please check the Washington State Library catalog [www.secstate.wa.gov/library](http://www.secstate.wa.gov/library) to see if an item's call number has changed.

NW prefixed books are available for checkout and interlibrary loan. RARE, R (Reference), and GWA (Governor's Writers Award) prefixed books are available to be viewed only at the State Library. WA prefixed books are in the Washington State Publications collection. Copy 2s are available for checkout and interlibrary loan while copy 1s are available to be viewed at the State Library.
