Sam was appointed Washington's first Poet Laureate by Gov. Gregoire on December 17, 2007 and his first two-year term will come to an end this year. During his tenure he has been able to promote poetry throughout the state by giving readings, attending workshops, and making personal appearances.

Living in a hand-built log home on a remote island in the San Juans may not be everyone's idea of perfection, but Sam and Sally moved there 26 years ago to give their lives over full-time to poetry. They are the publishers of the award-winning Brooding Heron Press located on Waldron Island which focuses on the works of Washington poets.
