

## **Magazines available as press braille or Web-Braille**

### **Boys' Life** (monthly)

Articles on the outdoors, sports, and hobbies, with adventure fiction and humor; ages 9 to 16. Published by the Boy Scouts of America.

### **Braille Book Review** (bimonthly)

Announcements of braille books recently added to the Library of Congress collection; news and developments in library services for blind individuals. Includes one-line annotations from *Talking Book Topics* and a braille order form.

### **Braille Chess Magazine** (British quarterly)

Articles on chess; news of current trends and competitions.

### **Braille Music Magazine** (British monthly)

Articles about classical music for professional and amateur musicians; reviews of new braille music publications.

### **Conundrum** (British monthly)

Crossword and logic puzzles, anagrams, word search, and general-knowledge quizzes.

### **Cooking Light** (11 issues)

Short articles on exercise, food, fitness, health, and nutrition. Each issue contains approximately seventy recipes that feature fresh, natural ingredients and low-fat cooking.

### **ESPN: The Magazine** (biweekly)

Sports news and information; player profiles.

### **Harper's** (monthly)

General culture magazine with articles by well-known writers on politics, international affairs, education, and science; includes short stories, satire, and poetry.

### **Health Newsletters** (includes **Harvard Health Letter**, **Mayo Clinic Health Letter**, and **University of California at Berkeley Wellness Letter**; monthly)

Current health concerns, medical information, nutrition, and stress management from *Harvard Health Letter*, *Mayo Clinic Health Letter*, and *University of California at Berkeley Wellness Letter*.

### **Kiplinger's Personal Finance Magazine** (monthly)

General-interest articles on managing finances, including taxes, investment options, real estate, insurance, and retirement planning.

### **Ladies' Home Journal** (11 issues)

Articles and fiction intended for women; includes household hints, recipes, and ideas on fashion and beauty.

**Martha Stewart Living** (monthly)

Offers recipes and gardening, crafts, collectibles, reminiscence, housekeeping, and entertaining tips.

**Muse** (for children; 9 issues)

Offers science, art, archaeology, and history activities for ages 10 to 15; includes contests and book and media reviews.

**The Musical Mainstream** (quarterly)

Selected articles from national magazines about classical music, music criticism, and music teaching; lists new NLS music acquisitions.

**National Geographic** (monthly)

Articles on world geography and cultures, plant and animal life, space exploration, and ancient history.

**The New York Times Book Review** (weekly)

Literary articles and book reviews from the Sunday *New York Times*.

**The New York Times Large Print Weekly** (weekly)

Highlights from the *New York Times*.

**News** (NLS quarterly)

National and international developments in library services to blind and physically handicapped individuals. The text of *News* is included in the audio edition of *Talking Book Topics*.

**Parenting Early Years** (11 issues)

Tips and advice for mothers of children age 0 to 5.

**Parenting School Years** (11 issues)

Tips and advice for mothers of children age 6 to 11.

**PC World** (monthly)

Information for computer users about hardware, software, advanced technology, and trends in the field; columns on product reviews and helpful hints.

**Playboy** (11 issues)

Fiction, interviews, and articles with a male perspective.

**Poetry** (11 issues)

Contemporary poetry selected from a wide range of contributors and styles.

**Popular Communications** (monthly)

Articles of current and historical interest specifically for the radio hobbyist.

**Popular Mechanics** (monthly)

Practical advice for the amateur mechanic; information on automotive and home repairs; features on new equipment.

**Popular Music Lead Sheets** (irregular)

Melodies, lyrics, and chords to popular songs ranging from golden oldies to recent hits.

**Rolling Stone** (24 issues)

**Science News** (26 issues)

**Short Stories** (British monthly)

Stories from contemporary writers.

**Stone Soup** (for children; 6 issues)

Stories, poems, illustrations, and book reviews created by children through age 13. Features an activities section with suggested related projects.
