

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**EXHIBIT A**

The term "document" in this subpoena means any written, typed, graphic, recorded, or electronically stored matter whatsoever. The term "document" thus includes, without limitation, emails, letters, faxes, pictures, files, summaries, spreadsheets, notes, drafts, and working papers.

All documents in your possession, custody or control regarding the process whereby a felon's right to vote is restored. Without limitation, responsive documents should include:

- (1) Communications between you and members of the public regarding the process whereby a felon's right to vote is restored;
- (2) Communications between you and members of the public regarding whether any given felon may legally vote;
- (3) Internal King County documents regarding the process whereby a felon's right to vote is restored; and
- (4) Internal King County documents regarding whether any given felon may legally vote.
