WAR RUMORS.

London, April 9, 5 A. M.—The Berlin Post, ministerial journal, has a leading article saying that recent events unfortunately render it too probable that the present French assembly, fearing there will be a republican majority in the next assembly, are anxious to precipitate a war of revenge under the dangerous auspices of Marshal MacMahon and the Orleans princes.

The Berlin correspondent of the London Times says: "This article is liable to have a strong effect, and alarming rumors are rife. The same correspondent states that since the meeting of the Emperor Francis Joseph and King Victor Emanuel, there is even less prospect than before in Berlin of conceiving common measures with Austria and Italy in relation to the personal responsibility of the Pope."
