


Washington State Libraries Screen Appearance -- Search Screen



The simplest screen that a library can use as a default is the search screen. This screen presents the user with a search box, without first showing which databases are available. From the Search screen, the user can see the Database list by clicking on “Select Multiple Databases” in the center of the screen. Then the user will be able to select specific databases to search.


Whether the Search screen appears first, or after a Database screen, it will default to one of the following:

- Search by Word Basic (illustrated above)
- Search by Word Guided
- Search by Topic (only enabled if K-12 databases are selected)

Please choose one of these options on the datasheet.

Note: If a library does not want a particular database automatically checked for searching, they should contact PQ technical support.

Washington State Libraries Screen Appearance—Database View Academic Compressed



The library must select which Database view its users will see. The options are explained in Appendix E. The screen shot above is an illustration of what a Compressed view looks like, with the default academic databases selected. The choices are either:


- Compressed view (illustrated above) or
- Expanded view

The Compressed view summarizes the separate databases the library has chosen in their package. The user can check a specific database to search or can search all databases from this Compressed view. Then the user will see the search screen the library has designated. The Expanded view will itemize all the modules available within the databases the library has chosen in their package.

We strongly recommend that the Compressed view be chosen instead of the Expanded view for reasons outlined in Appendix E.


Washington State Libraries Screen Appearance—Database View Public
