About the Combined Fund Drive



Our History

The Combined Fund Drive (CFD) is one of the nation's only independent workplace giving programs for public employees. Through the CFD, state and higher education employees and retirees are invited to give to the charity of their choice through payroll contribution and agency fundraising events.

To date, donors have pledged more than \$125 million to charities in their communities and throughout the world, changing the lives of those most in need.

The CFD was established in 1984 in an Executive Order by Governor John Spellman with the help of the Thurston County Auditor (and former Secretary of State) Sam Reed.

In 2000, the Ethics Board deemed the Combined Fund Drive an official part of state business, which means that volunteers of the CFD are allowed to visit the website, manage their donations and even plan and execute fundraising events for the CFD during working hours.

Our Campaign

The Combined Fund Drive campaign runs annually from the beginning of October to the end of December and is administered in over 250 different agencies and higher education institutions.

County Committees also put together events around the state that help bring donations to the charities of the CFD



Roles and Responsibilities

A Campaign Leader is an employee who is appointed by their respective state agency director or higher education president to lead the Combined Fund Drive effort in their workplace. Successful Campaign Leaders are enthusiastic, connected, creative and collaborative.

What does a Campaign Leader do?

They recruit Local Coordinators.

A campaign the size of the Combined Fund Drive cannot be accomplished at an agency level by one employee. That's why the CFD office encourages Campaign Leaders to recruit as many volunteers as possible throughout the state to assist with the annual giving campaign.

They Communicate.

The Campaign Leader delivers the good news of the CFD to fellow workplace employees and executive management. They are available to answer questions and help promote a positive image of the CFD.

They Conduct Fundraisers.

Campaign Leaders manage all fundraising activities within the agency/campus, and log those fundraisers into the CFD at the end of the campaign.
