MEASURES ON THE BALLOT

Initiative Measure No. 1433 increases minimum wage to \$13.50.

Initiative Measure No. 1464 concerns campaign finance laws and lobbyists.

Initiative Measure No. 1491 concerns court-issued extreme risk protection orders temporarily preventing access to firearms.

Initiative Measure No. 1501 concerns protection of seniors and vulnerable individuals.

Initiative Measure No. 732 concerns carbon emission taxes.

Initiative Measure No. 735 concerns a proposed amendment to the federal constitution.

Senate Joint Resolution 8210 concerns a constitutional amendment on the deadline for completing state legislative and congressional redistricting.

Advisory Vote No. 14 insurance premium tax to some insurance for stand-alone family dental plans

Advisory Vote No. 15 limitations on the retail sales and use tax exemptions for clean alternative-fuel vehicles

September 24 – Deadline to mail military and overseas ballots for the November General Election

September 26 - 30– College Civics Week

September 27 - National Voter Registration Day

October 8 - Voters' Pamphlet Residential Delivery Begins (thru October 15)

October 10 - Deadline to update voter registration or register by mail or online

October 21 - General Election 18-day voting period begins/ Deadline to mail regular ballots

October 31 - November 4- Student Mock Election

October 31 – Last day to register in person

November 8 – General Election Day

November 29 – County Canvassing Board certifies General Election results

December 8 – Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results

December 19 – Electoral College meets at Capitol
