


Same Day Registration

- During regular business hours and up until 8 p.m. on Election Day, citizens can register or update their address information and vote in person at a local voting center or county elections office.
- Citizens can check registration status at VoteWA.gov



Prepaid Postage

 With prepaid postage, every mailbox is a drop box.



- USPS pickup times vary. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by Election Day to be valid and counted.
- Ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m. on Election Day. Listings of locations can be found at VoteWA.gov

Online Registration

 Until 8 days before Election Day, citizens can register to vote or update their information online at VoteWA.gov. The submission must be received by the elections office no later than 8 days before Election Day.

Washington State Election Laws

Same Day Registration
