



2019 Candidate Filing - Lot Drawing Results Report May 17, 2019

Following the close of candidate filing, the order of candidates printed on ballots is determined by lot.

The Secretary of State is the filing officer for Federal, State offices and Supreme Court, as well as Legislative Districts and Superior Court and Appeals Court Districts comprising more than one county.

Ballot order for all other offices is determined by the county filing officer.

This year four offices filed with the Secretary of State.

This lot draw will only apply to the offices that appear in the Primary. If a primary is not held, the order will apply to the General Election.

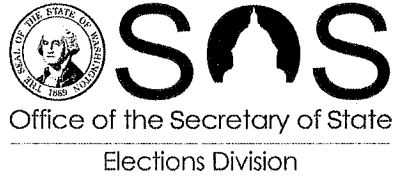

Certificate of Lot Draw Results

Time: 5:17 pm

After the close of business on the last day for candidates to file for office, the filing officer shall determine by lot the order in which the names of those candidates will appear on all ballots. The determination shall be done publicly and may be witnessed by the media and by any candidate. If no primary is required for a race, the names of candidates in that race shall appear on the general election ballot in the order determined by lot. RCW 29A.36.131.

Result of Lot Draw.

The candidate as filed will be assigned the ballot order according to the number drawn. The number removed from the ball is the ballot order of the candidate in the applicable race.

1st Candidate filed moves to Ballot Order position	<u>1</u>
2nd Candidate filed moves to Ballot Order position	<u>2</u>
3rd Candidate filed moves to Ballot Order position	<u>3</u>
4th Candidate filed moves to Ballot Order position	<u>6</u>

6th Candidate filed moves to Ballot Order position	<u>4</u>






Prior to the draw, the Secretary of State's representative explained:

- The official lot draw applies only to candidates filing with the Secretary of State.
- The candidates filing list is in chronological order based upon when candidates filed for a race.
- The number drawn by lot represents the ballot order for the applicable candidate, and
- The pattern of numbers drawn applies to each race for the initial appearance on the ballot.
