



Key dates



October 16 — Deadline for ballots to be mailed to voters

October 26 — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

October 27 — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back one week before Election Day

November 3 — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote **in person** by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be **postmarked** by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

November 24 — County Canvassing Boards certify General Election results

December 3 — Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results

December 14 — Electoral College casts votes




