#### **Key dates**



October 21 - Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

October 31 - Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

**November 1** – USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before Election Day

#### November 8 — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote in person by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be postmarked by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

November 29 — County canvassing boards certify General Election results

December 8 - Last day for Secretary of State to certify **General Election results**


