Key dates



October 21 — Start of voting period and deadline for counties to mail out ballots to voters

October 31 — Last day for online and mailed registrations or updates to be received

November 1 — USPS recommends mailing voted ballot back at least one week before Election Day

November 8 — Election Day:

- Register or update info and vote **in person** by 8 p.m.
- Mailed ballot must be **postmarked** by today
- Official ballot drop boxes are open until 8 p.m.

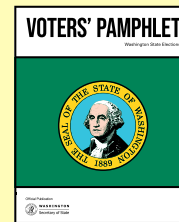
November 29 — County canvassing boards certify General Election results

December 8 — Last day for Secretary of State to certify General Election results

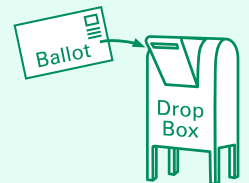
Drop boxes and voting centers

Advisory votes are the result of Initiative 960, approved by voters in 2007. Advisory votes are non-binding. The results will not change the law.
