STIPULATED ORDER ON BALLOT TITLE APPEALS- 1

Smith & Lowney, P.L.L.C. 2317 E. John St Seattle, WA 98112 (206) 860-2883 WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 29A.72.080, petitioner Leslie Cushman, sponsor of Initiative Measure Nos. 939 and 949, appealed the ballot title formulated by the Attorney General for Initiative Measure Nos. 939 and 940, and filed a petition demonstrating an alleged prejudicial ambiguity in the titles; and

WHEREAS Petitioner proposed amendments to remove such ambiguity as to Initiative 940 and has agreed to dismiss the appeal regarding Initiative 939;

WHEREAS the Attorney General's Office does not object to Petitioner's proposed amendments, and agrees that they would make it easier for the public to understand the measure;

Now, therefore, the Court being fully advised, hereby ORDERS that the ballot title for Initiative 940 shall be amended to read as follows:

## Initiative 940:

Statement of Subject: Initiative Measure No. 940 concerns law enforcement.

This measure would require law enforcement to receive violence deescalation, mental-health, and first-aid training, and provide first-aid; and change standards for use of deadly force, adding a "good faith" standard and independent investigation.

## **Ballot Measure Summary**

This measure would require all law enforcement officers in the state to receive violence de-escalation and mental health training, as developed by the criminal justice training commission. It would require law enforcement

personnel to provide first-aid to save lives and require law enforcement agencies to adopt guidelines for implementing this duty. It would amend 2 the standards for justifiable use of deadly force by law enforcement, including adding a "good faith" standard and requiring independent 3 investigation.
