The King County Council passed Ordinance No. 15537 concerning this proposition for the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) levy. This proposition would fund the continued operation and enhancement of the AFIS program, which assists law enforcement agencies in identifying and convicting criminals. It would authorize King County to levy an additional regular property tax of not more than \$0.0568 (5.68 cents) per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2007 and levy the tax each year thereafter as allowed by chapter 84.55 RCW for each of the five succeeding years. THE CITY OF SEATTLE INITIATIVE NO. 88 PROPERTY TAX LEVY LID LIFT FOR SCHOOLS

Seattle Initiative Measure No. 88 concerns tax levies to fund the Seattle School District's educational programs.

If enacted, this measure would allow increased property taxes to be collected in 2008 through 2013 to provide funding for educational programs of the Seattle School District. It would lift the RCW 84.55 limit on regular property taxes so that the total regular tax limit for collection in 2008 would be \$3.27/\$1,000 assessed value. Each year from 2009 through 2013, the additional regular property taxes that could be collected would increase at the same rate as the consumer price index.





# Dear King County Voters,

This is an exciting year. New voter registrations are pouring in and there is an almost contagious energy about the elections process. It's important that we get it right.

- 1. Choose a party mark your preference at the start of your ballot; 2. Vote for candidates within that party - the ballot is color-coded and labeled to
- 3. Complete the ballot vote in the nonpartisan contests and on ballot measures help you locate candidates of your party choice; and
- even if you choose not to select a party.

Throughout the voters' pamphlet we've included information about how the new primary works and reminders to follow the simple three step instructions. The pamphlet is organized to match the layout of the new ballot with sections of candidate statements and photos, followed by information on the nonpartisan contests and ballot measures.

### **Q&A on the New Primary**

#### 1. How does the new primary change how I vote?

The new system requires you to select a party preference if you want to vote for candidates running for partisan offices. For the first time, you may vote only for the candidates in one political party in the primary. Your privacy will be protected; no record of your political party selection will be kept.

You will cast your votes by following three easy steps:

- 1. Choose a party by making your selection at the top of
- 2. Vote for candidates in that party (each party has its own section on the ballot).
- 3. Complete the ballot by voting in the nonpartisan contests and on ballot measures, even if you choose not to select a party.

#### 2. What will the ballot look like?

The single ballot provides a place to indicate your party preference (Democratic, Republican or Libertarian). It then presents the partisan contests in three sections, one for each party. Nonpartisan contests and ballot measures, available to all voters, are on the back of the ballot.

New ballot instructions are provided. The ballot is color coded to assist voters in making their party selection and then locating the part of the ballot dedicated to that party.

#### 3. Is there a change in the General Election?

No. The changes apply to the Primary Election only.

#### 4. How do the changes affect nonpartisan offices like judges and issues on the ballot?

Your opportunity to vote for candidates for nonpartisan offices and on ballot measures is not affected by this new law.

#### 5. Why has the Primary changed?

As a result of lawsuits filed by the Democratic, Republican and Libertarian parties, federal courts found Washington's blanket primary to be unconstitutional. Following this ruling, the Washington State Legislature adopted a new primary law that provided for two distinct types of primaries. Governor Gary Locke vetoed one of the models and signed the other - the "Montana primary" - into law, an action the Supreme Court upheld.

#### 6. Will my party choice be public?

No. Voters will indicate their party preference on the ballot, and no record is maintained that links that choice back to the voter.

#### 7. What happens if I don't choose a party?

If you do not choose a party, your votes in the partisan section of the ballot (e.g., Governor, senators, representatives, etc.) will not be counted. However, you can still vote in the nonpartisan

races (Judges, Superintendent of Public Instruction) and ballot measures (levies and bonds) listed at the end of the ballot - and that means your vote will be counted.

#### 8. If I choose a party, but vote for a candidate in another party, will my ballot be tossed out and not counted?

No. If a vote in a particular partisan race differs from the party preference you selected, your vote in that particular partisan race will not be counted. All of the partisan votes you cast that match your party preference will be counted (one vote per office).

#### 9. Is voting Libertarian like voting Independent? If I choose Libertarian, can I cross back and forth between the major parties?

No, the Libertarian party is one of three parties designated as major parties in state law. They achieved major party status by having a candidate for statewide office receive more than 5% of the total vote in the 2000 election. Just as with the Democratic and Republican parties, voters who select the Libertarian party as a preference may only cast votes for Libertarian candidates on the partisan section of the primary ballot.

#### 10. What about the Green Party or other parties, do they appear on the primary ballot?

No. Minor party candidates are nominated by convention and nominating petitions. Once qualified, minor party candidates are placed directly on the General Election ballot and do not appear on primary ballots.

#### 11. What happens if I make a mistake when marking my ballot?

The best way to avoid mistakes is to read through the instructions, look through your ballot, and then choose a party - and then vote for candidates in that party only. If you are filling out your ballot at home, there is an easy process to follow to correct mistakes. Instructions for doing so are printed at the top of the ballot. You may also contact King County Elections to request a new ballot. If you are voting in a polling booth and make a mistake, ask the poll workers for a new ballot. They will destroy the spoiled one.

### 12. Who do I contact with concerns about the new system?

The blanket primary was found by the courts to be unconstitutional. This opinion has been appealed and was ultimately upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court. The Washington State Legislature adopted the new primary that will be in place this September.



In the November 2005 General Election, Whatcom County voters approved an amendment to the Whatcom County Charter that adds a duty on the Auditor to publish and distribute a Local Voters' Pamphlet for primary and general elections.

We are very excited that this is the first Local Voters' Pamphlet in Whatcom County's history! Inside you will find candidate's photos and statements as well as statements on a ballot issue. Please review the Local Voters' Pamphlet for details regarding voting in the primary, registering to vote, change of address, drop site locations and other important information.

For the first time in Whatcom County we will be using a consolidated ballot for the Primary Election. Court decisions require a "pick-a-party" primary. The system requires you to select a party ballot if you wish to vote for candidates in a partisan office. You can only vote for the candidates of the one political party you select for the primary. Your privacy will be protected; the political party you choose for the primary will not go on record. Your opportunity to vote for candidates for non-partisan offices is not affected. Remember, this change applies only to the primary election.

If you have not received your ballot fifteen (15) days prior to the election, please call the Elections Division of the Whatcom County Auditor's Office at 360-676-6742 to have a replacement ballot mailed to you. Please help us ensure that you receive your ballot by notifying Elections if your mailing address has recently changed. Feel free to call if you have any questions about the voting process and/or your ballot.

AN IMPORTANT REMINDER: To ensure your vote will be counted, your ballot needs to be postmarked no later than Election Day. If you prefer, you may drop your ballot off at the curbside Ballot Drop Box, 311 Grand Ave., near the Courthouse Rotunda, Bellingham, WA or at the Whatcom County Auditor's Office, 311 Grand Ave., Suite 103, Bellingham, beginning 20 days prior to the election. The curbside Ballot Drop Box and the Drop Box at the Auditor's Office will close at 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Please refer to the Local Voters' Pamphlet for drop site locations open on Election Day only.

I would like to praise Whatcom County voters for their approval of a Local Voters' Pamphlet. Knowledge empowers you to make informed choices that ultimately shape the future governing of our community, state, and nation.
