



CERTIFICATION OF DOMINION ASSURE 1.3

On September, 30 2014 King County Deputy Elections Director Julie Wise Designee requested the Office of the Secretary of State approve Dominion Voting ASSURE 1.3 system and associated software and firmware, for use in King County on a provisional basis. This modification to King County's existing voting system is necessary in order to minimize the overall risk of administering elections in King County. Failure to modify the existing system will materially affect the efficiency, accuracy and security of the upcoming elections.

Upon examination of the system, the Secretary of State finds ASSURE 1.3 satisfies the requirements of Washington State law, has been certified by a voting system test laboratory and has been certified by the Election Assistance Commission in 2012. This version of the system consists of:

- *Hardware* comprised of:
 - DRS 960 Scanner
 - AccuVote TSX equipped with AccuView Printer
 - UAID (controller, sip n puff, ADA switch kit)

- *Software* comprised of:
 - GEMS 1.21.6
 - Key Card Tool 4.7.8
 - VCProgrammer 4.7.8
 - Premier Central Scan (PCS) 2.2.5
 - Assure Security Manager 1.2.5
 - Ballot Station 4.7.10 for TSX
 - ABasic Report Files 2.2.5 for TSX
 - AutoMARK AIMS 1.3

On this date, under the provisions of WAC 434-335-210 and 212, the Office of the Secretary of State hereby certifies the "ASSURE 1.3" for use by King County of the State of Washington when used in compliance with the procedures contained in this certification, accompanying Reports and Findings, and Washington State law.
