They can be on any topic or many, are usually written by one person or a few individuals, and typically provide an individualistic or alternative point of view.

- ◆ Participants must be Washington State Residents
- ◆ Zines must be about some aspect of Washington's History
- ◆ Submissions will be read by people of all ages; please only use non-offensive content in your zine.
- ◆ Make at least 4 copies of your zine submit 3 and keep the others for yourself. Sharing and trading is a traditional aspect of zine culture! Entries will not be returned and may be added to a library's collection or used in promotional materials.
- ◆ By submission, the participants grant permission for the library to display, photograph & reproduce the submitted work for publicity purposes
