



How to find Washington State DEATH RECORDS

Who has the records?

Death certificates from July 1, 1907 to two months before the present day are held by the [Washington Department of Health](http://www.doh.wa.gov/LicensesPermitsandCertificates/BirthDeathMarriageandDivorce/CertificateOrderingInformation.aspx).

For recent death certificates, in the current or previous month, contact the [local health department](http://www.doh.wa.gov/AboutUs/PublicHealthSystem/LocalHealthJurisdictions.aspx) where the death occurred. www.doh.wa.gov/AboutUs/PublicHealthSystem/LocalHealthJurisdictions.aspx

Anyone can request a copy of a Washington State death certificate from the Department of Health. You do not need to prove a family connection.

What records are there before 1907?

The counties were responsible for collecting death records before July 1, 1907, which was the day that the state took over.

Most counties kept **death registers**, where each death was 'registered' by entering it into a ledger. Some counties also had death returns, which were single sheets of paper filled out for each deceased person, whose family came to register the death. Unfortunately, some people did not register the deaths in their family with the county, and there are no records for them.

The county death registers have been microfilmed, and are available at the [Washington State Library](http://www.washingtonstate.gov). They have also been scanned and are available on Ancestry.com, and on Washington State Digital Archives (see below).
