



### Sustainable Institutional Preservation Programs Work Group



**CHARGE:**  
identify the elements of a state-wide plan that would help institutions create and sustain preservation programs



### COMPONENTS

assess, train,  
model, fund, inform



### ASSESS

- provide competitive grant funding for preservation assessments
- provide a list of resources for undertaking preservation assessments on a website

### TRAIN



- offer free or inexpensive preservation workshops throughout the state
- advertise preservation workshops available locally or via distant education by a listserv (PreserveNW) and/or website



### MODEL

- identify institutions of varying types/sizes to serve as model peer preservation programs
- provide a list of resources that discuss adapting preservation programs to a wide range of institution types

## FUND



- fund collaborative disaster planning
- provide competitive grant funding similar to WPI Competitive Preservation Grants

## INFORM



- provide a website and use the PreserveNW listserv as an information clearinghouse
- publicize the website and listserv widely
